Thank you for your interest in the post of Academy Director Head of Mathematics at Paignton Academy. The vast majority of our pupils live in Paignton and transition smoothly post 16 to South Devon College.

The Academy has twin sites at Borough Road and Waterleat Road, with approximately 720 pupils on each site. In 2019, a successful restructure of the Academy resulted in a move from separate upper and lower school sites to one school, two sites.

The Academy is part of the Bay Education Trust, founded in 2014, which consists of Paignton Academy and two primary academies, Kings Ash and Curledge Street.

The trustees are totally committed to our '2 to 22' vision which insists that every child who attends our academies will receive the best education possible that fits their individual needs. Every child is important to us and our ethos and values are at the forefront of everything we do.

During the last four years the Trust has received over £7 million in funding from the government and Torbay local authority, to update and improve our premises. The majority of this funding has been targeted at Paignton Academy. This has meant the building of a new mathematics block at our Waterleat Road site and a new state of the art Arena and dining hall at our Borough Road site.

Paignton Academy is a dynamic institution that is making a real difference to the lives of its young people and this is a wonderful opportunity for a committed, ambitious teacher to take the Academy into the future and the ultimate full realisation of the Trust's 2 to 22 vision.

Paignton Academy is the largest secondary school in Torbay, split across two sites: Waterleat Road and Borough Road. Crucially, each site replicates the other and so we have years 7-11 on each site.

The Academy prides itself on being an integral part of the community it serves; importantly, all pupils are welcome at Paignton Academy and the Academy recently reorganised itself to ensure all children in Torbay were able to secure a school place.

As the largest school in Torbay and the only secondary school in Paignton, there are very strong links within the local and wider community. The outstanding sporting facilities provide a central hub of community sport for the entirety of Torbay. As a host site for adult, junior and disability sports such as football and netball, on a weekly basis over 2000 members of the community take part in regular physical activity at the Academy.

The school leads a primary sports partnership of 8 primary schools and holds the School Games organiser role for Torbay which benefits pupils across the area. Previously, we have hosted the Devon School Games and the South West Youth Games. Throughout recent months strong links have been built with local food charities including the foodbank; Academy staff have organised and delivered over 1400 meals and 500 food parcels throughout lockdown to targeted families. Paignton Parish Church is a key partner, there is a long-standing link with Paignton Zoo and an Interact club has been built with the regular input of the district Rotary officers; this showcases a wealth of cohesion between the Academy and local organisations.

The Academy is also proud to provide a vast range of extra-curricular opportunities which support pupils' personal development. Academy pupils can gain the Duke of Edinburgh Award, undertake Bikeability cycle training, join the Academy Council or the Junior Rotary Club. Participation in extra-curricular clubs is excellent and 96% of parents report that their child takes part in clubs and activities at the school.

The Mathematics Department at Paignton Academy

The Mathematics department at Paignton Academy focuses on planning for pupils personalised needs together with high level explaining and questioning to draw out the pupils' ideas. We closely monitor pupil knowledge, understanding and skills enabling our learners to develop a deep and connected understanding of Maths. It is crucial that we are effective at enthusing and engaging pupils, allowing them to thrive in a mathematical rich environment.

The department comprises of fifteen full-time teachers. It is a cohesive and close-knit department which facilitates discussion and the sharing of ideas. We have dedicated collaboration time timetabled allowing staff to share ideas and to benefit from faculty-led CPD, ensuring that we are at the fore-front of pedagogy and change.

We follow a 'mastery curriculum' in teaching Mathematics, linking a vast array of resources including *White Rose Maths, Mathspad, Mathsbox, Just Maths* and *Dr Frost*. This enables all teachers to plan and deliver inspiring lessons with a variety of activities to support the learning of our pupils. At GCSE, pupils undertake AQA Mathematics with the option of studying GCSE statistics as an after-school activity.

All classrooms have Promethian screens and whiteboards, resources to support diagnostic questioning and numicon to help scaffold learning. The central philosophy of the department is to provide a comprehensive and inspirational service to pupils of all abilities through not only curriculum time but also through extra help in surgeries and revision sessions. The department prides itself on providing a rich and engaging classroom environment. We encourage pupils to learn together whilst being guided and inspired by expert teachers.

Everything we do in Maths at Paignton Academy is underpinned by our belief that Mathematics is a creative and highly interconnected discipline that has been developed in many different cultures over centuries, providing the solution to some of history's most intriguing problems. It is a universal language which is essential to everyday life, critical to science, technology, and engineering, and necessary for financial literacy and most forms of employment. A high-quality Mathematics education therefore provides a foundation for understanding the world, the ability to reason mathematically, an appreciation of the beauty and power of Mathematics, and a sense of enjoyment and curiosity about the subject.

The Academy has a rich history of Sports College status and phenomenal PE facilities which was a huge attraction for me. Having arrived at Paignton Academy for the first placement of my teacher training, it became very apparent to me early on that the school was a place that would be hard to leave. There is an energy and feeling around both the corridors and classrooms at Paignton Academy that is somewhat infectious. Having been invited to return at the end of my training year, whilst still on placement, it was a very easy decision to make and it was an offer I could not turn down.

Our children are charismatic, kind, enthusiastic and incredibly loyal, once you have established a foundation of trust. When our children feel seen, heard and valued, there is very little that they won't strive for on their quest to repay you. It is only fair to share an anecdote as testimony of this... I once told a Year 10 class that I was upset due to the loss of our family dog and the impact it had on my mum. The somewhat 'lively' class respected this and were perfect. I thought nothing more of it. However, the next day the class arrived with a bunch of flowers that they had put their own money towards to give not to me but to my mum. And so, if I could only choose one moment that captures the essence of our students, it would be this!



Since arriving at Paignton Academy, the Senior Leadership Team has been very encouraging and supportive of my professional development. As an NQT, there was a CPD programme that allowed for considered development very early on. During this time and despite thinking as an NQT I might be rather low down on the considerations of SLT, I always felt enabled to sit and talk openly with the leadership team to explore my evolution as a practitioner. This has continued over the course of my five years at Paignton and I am fortunate to consider the Deputy Principal a key mentor as well as feeling very much 'seen' by our new head, Derwyn Williams. Living and working in the South West

Paignton (population: 49,021) is one of three towns within Torbay, a unitary authority. The other two towns are Torquay (population: 51,573) and Brixham (population: 16,823). Situated on the English Riviera, it offers 22 miles of stunning coastline which is an UNESCO designated Global Geopark.



To the north of Torbay is Dartmoor National Park. Along the coast is South Devon and the South Hams - an area of outstanding natural beauty. The popular towns of Dartmouth, Totnes and Kingsbridge are a short drive from Paignton.

Transport links into Torbay are good with train services into Paignton and Torquay. Road infrastructure has been recently improved with the thriving city of Exeter now 30 mins journey by car. The ocean city of Plymouth is 45 minutes by car.

As befitting a major tourist destination, there are ample opportunities for dining with many award-winning restaurants. Given the dramatic coastline and the close proximity of Dartmoor National Park, there are many opportunities for outdoor, active pursuits be they along the coast or in the countryside.

Torbay, and particularly Paignton, is also undergoing significant improvement and investment. In 2021, the government gave the go-ahead for over £13m funding to improve the town centre which would see the redevelopment of the Crossways shopping centre, new flood defences, restoration of Paignton Picture House, upgrade of Station Square and a residential development which would create 400 new homes.

Job Purpose: To provide strategic leadership and high-quality management of the Mathematics

Faculty within the Academy, as part of the Senior Leadership Team.

Pay Scale: Leadership Scale L7-11 [ACADEMY DIRECTOR- SLT]

Professional Duties

A person appointed as an Academy Director will form part of the Senior Leadership Team and, in addition to carrying out the professional duties of a teacher, other than those duties particularly assigned to them by the Head of School, will:

- Play a major role under the overall direction of the Head of School in:
 - a) Formulating the aims and objectives of the Academy.
 - b) Establishing the policies through which they will be achieved.
 - c) Managing staff and resources to that end.
 - d) Monitoring progress towards their achievement.
- Undertake any professional duties reasonably delegated to them by the Head of School.
- Be entitled to a break of reasonable length as near to the middle of each school day as is reasonably practicable.

Job Purpose

To provide high-quality leadership which ensures success and improvement in the Academy. The Academy Director should ensure a high-quality education is provided for all students, with improving standards of learning and achievement.



Professional Knowledge and Understanding

The Academy Director should demonstrate a broad range of knowledge and understanding, both academic and pastoral, and should demonstrate leadership, management and personal skills and attributes to ensure the efficient and effective running of the Academy.

An Academy Director should have some knowledge and understanding of:

- a) What constitutes quality in educational provision; the characteristics of effective schools and strategies for raising pupils' achievement and promoting their spiritual, moral, social and cultural development, as well as their good behaviour.
- b) Strategies to achieve effective teaching and learning across the Academy including literacy, numeracy and ICT.
- c) The application of information and communications technology to teaching and learning and management.
- d) How to use comparative data, together with information about pupils' prior attainment, to establish benchmarks and set targets for improvement.
- e) Requirements and models for the curriculum and its assessment.
- f) Effective teaching and assessment methods, including the use of information and communications technology.
- g) Leadership styles and practices within the school.
- h) The national policy framework and the complementary roles and functions of the DfE, and the Code of Conduct and practice of the General Teaching Council of England.
- i) The statutory framework for education now in place, relevant to the specific role of Assistant Head of School.
- j) The contribution that evidence from inspection and research can make to professional and school development.
- k) Strategies for teaching pupils about the duties, opportunities, responsibilities and rights of citizens.
- I) Strategies for teaching pupils about ethnic and cultural diversity.



An Academy Director should demonstrate an ability to:

- a) Create and secure commitment to a clear vision for an effective institution.
- b) Initiate and manage change and improvement in pursuit of strategic objectives.
- c) Prioritise, plan and organise.
- d) Direct and co-ordinate the work of others.
- e) Build, support and work with high-performing teams.
- f) Work as part of a team.
- g) Devolve responsibilities, delegate tasks and monitor practice to see that they are being carried out.
- h) Set standards and provide a role model for pupils and staff.
- i) Seek advice and support when necessary.
- j) Deal sensitively with people and resolve conflicts.
- k) Command credibility through the discharge of their functions and to influence others.
- 1) Provide professional direction to the work of others.
- m) Make informed use of inspection and research findings.
- n) Make decisions based upon analysis, interpretation and understanding of relevant data and information.
- o) Think creatively and imaginatively to anticipate and solve problems, and identify opportunities.
- p) Demonstrate good judgement.

Strategic Direction and Development of the Academy

The Academy Director works with Bay Education Trust, the Head of School and other stakeholders to secure strategic direction for Paignton Academy and analyse and plan for its future needs and further development within the local, national and international context.

An Academy Director should:

a) Lead by example, provide inspiration and motivation and embody for the pupils, staff, governors and parents, the vision, purpose and leadership of the Academy.



- b) Assist in the creation of an ethos and provide educational vision and direction which secures effective teaching, successful learning and achievement by pupils.
- c) Assist in the creation and implementation of a strategic plan, which identifies priorities and targets for ensuring that pupils achieve high standards and make progress, increasing teachers' effectiveness and securing school improvement.
- d) Ensure that all those involved in the school are committed to its aims, motivated to achieve them and involved in meeting long, medium and short-term objectives and targets which secure the educational success of the school.
- e) Communicate effectively to a range of audiences.
- f) Negotiate and consult effectively.
- g) Manage good communication systems.
- h) Chair meetings effectively.

Job Description

Teaching and Learning

The Academy Director works with Bay Education Trust, the Head of School and all stakeholders to secure and sustain effective teaching and learning throughout the Academy. They will monitor and evaluate the quality of teaching and standards of pupils' achievement using baseline data and set targets for improvement.

An Academy Director will:

- a) Create and maintain an environment and code of behaviour which promote and secure good teaching, effective learning, high standards of achievement, and good behaviour and discipline, and which enable teachers to meet the standards set out in the professional development framework.
- b) Determine, organise and implement the curriculum and its assessment; monitor and evaluate them in order to identify and act on areas for improvement.
- c) Ensure that effective, appropriate tutorial support is available to pupils.
- d) Monitor and evaluate the quality of teaching and standards of learning and achievement of all pupils, including those with special educational or linguistic needs, in order to set and meet challenging, realistic targets for improvement.
- e) Create and maintain an effective partnership with parents to support and improve pupils' achievement and personal development.

Leading and Managing Staff

An Academy Director, working with the Head of School and Assistant Heads of School, leads, motivates, supports, challenges and develops staff to secure improvement.

They:

- a) Maximise the contribution of staff to improving the quality of education provided and standards achieved, and ensure that constructive working relationships are formed between staff and pupils.
- b) Plan, allocate, support and evaluate work undertaken by groups, teams and individuals, ensuring clear delegation of tasks and devolution of responsibilities.

An Academy Director, working with the Head of School and Assistant Heads of School, deploys people effectively and efficiently to meet specific objectives within the school's strategic plan and financial context.

They:

- b) Work with the Head of School and senior colleagues to deploy and develop all staff effectively in order to improve the quality of education provided.
- c) Manage and organise accommodation efficiently and effectively to ensure that it meets the needs of the curriculum and health and safety regulations.
- **d)** Work with outside agencies to support staff and pupils within the Academy.

Accountability

An Academy Director accounts for the efficiency and effectiveness of their areas of responsibility in the Academy to Bay Education Trust, the Head of School, and other stakeholders.

They:

a) Assist in the provision of information, objective advice and support to the Trust to enable it to meet its responsibilities for securing effective teaching and learning and improved standards of achievement and for achieving efficiency and value for money.



- **b)** Assist in the creation and development of an organisation in which all staff recognise that they are accountable for the success of the Academy.
- c) Contribute to a coherent and accurate account of the school's performance in a form appropriate to a range of audiences, including the local community, OFSTED and others, to enable them to play their part effectively.
- d) Ensure that parents and pupils are well-informed about the curriculum, attainment and progress and about the contribution that they can make to achieving the school's targets for improvement.
