The Curriculum will equip students with knowledge and understanding about diverse places through studying the interactions between human and physical environments and processes. Students complete fieldwork activities throughout KS3 and we also offer a once in a lifetime opportunity to visit Iceland. KS4 Geography is incredibly popular and results have been on an upward trajectory since 2016.

The vision for History is to inspire in students a curiosity to know more about the past. The History curriculum will equip students with knowledge and understanding about the complexity of people's lives, the process of change, the diversity of societies and relationships between different groups, and utilise source material to develop critical analysis, in order to develop their own identity and engage with the challenges of their time. KS4 History is very popular, however results in History have not been at the expected level and as such is a key area for improvement.

The vision for Languages is to inspire in students a curiosity and deepen their understanding of the world, different cultures, geography and customs. MFL will foster tolerance and appreciation of other cultures and encourage critical, analytical thinking. Through the study of a foreign language, students will also gain a deeper appreciation of the formation, structure and application of English, improving their overall communication skills. MFL results in 2022 were outstanding and the popularity of MFL is growing each



year. The challenge within MFL is to continue growing the subjects so that more students are studying the Full Ebacc.

RE uses a variety of world views to navigate moral and ethical issues which allow a young person to develop their sense of self and their own values. All students study RE at KS3 and it is a very popular and successful subject at GCSE with a consistent positive progress score.

The school, in its entirety, is forward thinking, and therefore in the role of Achievement Leader, you would have the opportunity to continue the development of the Ebacc curriculum and develop it in the direction that would best suit our learners needs - both for the current and for their future. We are looking to appoint an Achievement Leader of EBacc to start April or September 2023. The EBacc faculty comprises of the subjects History, Geography, Religious Education, French and Spanish. We are seeking someone who will be ambitious for our students, and has a vision for the development of English in our curriculum. The challenge for the successful applicant will be to contribute to developing an already strong Faculty and lead the drive to raise standards across all disciplines at KS3 and GCSE. This role sits within the Senior Leadership Team alongside the Headteacher, 2 Heads of School, 6 Assistant Headteachers and 7 Achievement Leaders. The previous post holder has been promoted to the role of Assistant Headteacher, curriculum, after being in the school since an NQT.

The Ebacc Faculty is a leading faculty across both campuses. The faculty comprises of Geography, HIstory, RE, Spanish and French.

In Geography and History at Key Stage 3, students will have 75 minutes of Geography and History time every week. .They undertake a wide range of topics in Geography including Rivers and Coasts, Natural Hazards, Population, Development and Climate Change. In History students will study topics such as Black Americans, WW1 and WW2, the Edwardian Period

In Spanish and French at KS3, students will have 225 minutes of Languages spread over a fortnight. They undertake a wide range of topics such as My life, eating out and Education.

In RE at KS3, students will have 75 minutes of RE every week In year 7 and 9 and 75 minutes of RE per fortnight in Y8. In addition all students study 75 minutes of Ethics and Philosophy every fortnight in Year 10.

Students must study one Ebacc subject at KS4, however a large number of students opt to study more than one. To increase the number of students opting for the Full Ebacc, certain students are identified and recommended to study this pathway, however the full Ebacc is open to all students at Crestwood.

We have enhanced our campuses significantly over the past few years. We have refurbished nearly all areas across the school. We have had a new crescent area and roof at Shakespeare which has enhanced the building significantly. The Cherbourg Campus is situated between the town's two post-16 providers. The site is well maintained with specialist facilities in excellent condition throughout, including 5 new Science rooms and refurbished Sports Hall. In totality we are a school continually on the up and have a can-do-more attitude.

As a new member of staff you will be well supported: we have a comprehensive induction process, and you will be given an Induction Mentor and a 'professional buddy'. As the posts sits within the SLT you will receive direct support from the Headteacher and Heads of School.
