The Frank Field Education Trust (FFET) is a multi-academy trust (MAT) based in two Regional Schools Commissioners areas (L&WY and West Midlands) which aims to build on the work of the Outstanding teachers, leaders and schools within the Trust to serve the most disadvantaged schools and communities in England.

The founder and Chair of the Trust, the Rt. Hon. Lord Frank Field, served for almost 40 years as the Member of Parliament for Birkenhead. During this time, Frank has written extensively on education and, in 2010, wrote "The Foundation Years: preventing poor children becoming poor adults" report, which is regarded as a landmark document regarding the importance of education and Early Years care in ending disadvantage. The review found that the gap in cognitive, social and emotional skills between the most and least disadvantaged students starts well before children enter the education system. This gap widens still further during school years.

Our intention is to work with schools that buck this national trend, with the aim of equalising or bettering life chances by the time our young people leave school. We believe social justice can be achieved through excellence in education.

JOB DESCRIPTION:

Art & Design Technology Technician

Grade/Salary Scale: Grade 4 equating to (£14,285 to £15,160)
Reports to: Head of Design and Technology
Accountabilities: Teaching Groups - Student Progress and Achievement

The Technician is responsible, under the direction of the Curriculum Leaders for Art and Design Technology, for the effective delivery of technical support to the school, in the areas designated by this job description.

The Technician will have working knowledge, and experience of, technician responsibilities and will hold, or be willing to train for, the relevant accredited safety certification for working with the machinery and equipment for the role.

Technicians will not be responsible for other staff.

Duties:

- Preparation of materials to exact specification from stock, as directed, and clearing away equipment.
- Safe use of metal cutting, milling and turning machines, sewing machines and wood conversion machines (planer/thicknesser, circular saw and bandsaw).
- Tool maintenance - familiarisation with competence in:
 - (a) Sharpening techniques for edge and point cutting and marking tools, e.g. wood planes, chisels, twist drills, scribes, etc.
 - (b) Routine maintenance of all machinery, including textile machinery, hand and machine tools, making adjustments for wear and tear.
- Marking of models, fixtures etc. - the design and making of the jig, fixtures, racks, tool trays and teaching aids, as required by the school teaching staff, and working upon own initiative.
- Provision of support services to the teaching staff in organising requirements for their work, in both the Art and Design Technology departments.
- Oversight of specialised teaching areas, stores and preparation rooms and arrangements for maintenance and repair services to equipment and working surfaces.
- Maintenance of stock and breakage records, catalogues and user manuals.
- Ordering, receiving and accounting for new stock and equipment.
- Assisting in the maintenance of safety standards in the departments.
- Design and construction of apparatus.

- Assistance to teaching staff with demonstration lessons and practical lessons.
- Use of CAD/CAM machinery.
- Operation of audio-visual equipment and arrangement for appropriate maintenance and servicing.

Design Technology Department Information

In Key Stage 3, projects focus on assessment strands of the National Curriculum through both theory and practical work.

We currently offer GCSE 3D Design, Engineering and Food and are looking to expand our curriculum offer to our students.

We have high expectations of our students and aim to provide them with the skills necessary to aspire to be more in our subjects. We instil a love of learning in our students and pupil progress is at the heart of what we do.

There are two specialist Technology classrooms, a workshop with equipment for wood and metal working, including a brazing hearth area, and a food room. The Technology department has access to its own laptops with CAD software including 2D Design and Google Sketchup and facilities to be able to use Solidworks. We also have a Boxford laser cutter and equipment for ceramics, textiles, printmaking and electronics.

The department is keen to promote an innovative and caring environment where all students and staff feel happy and safe to work. Health and safety are regarded as being of paramount importance and the teaching and learning of this continues each year.

Art Department Information

The Art department offers students a wide range of learning experiences and is fully equipped to teach across Key Stage 3 and 4. The overriding aim of the department is to equip students with the necessary skills and tools to be able to express themselves creatively. We have the highest expectations of our students and hope to instil in them a high level of aspiration and determination, coupled with an enjoyment of Art and Design.

Facilities

The department has three practical classrooms in the main school with storage for work and materials and a separate Kiln room. There are desktop computers, Mac computers and laptops within the department which have Photoshop for use by the students. In addition, the department also has a set of digital cameras, a large A3 colour photocopier / printer and facilities / equipment for ceramics, textiles, photography and printmaking. Currently, there are two full time art teachers and one part time art teacher, who teach across both Key Stages. The department is also supported by one full time technician.

Curriculum

At KS3, our students follow a learning journey that builds skills and knowledge as they progress. Students are encouraged to develop their skills through a wide variety of projects and starting points. Students use sketchbooks and are encouraged to consider presentation and self evaluation as an integral part of their work. Students are taught a total of two periods per fortnight.

At KS4, students can opt to study Art or Photography, following the broad based AQA Art and Design course. Art and Photography are both a popular choice at GCSE, there is a high take up with excellent results. Students are encouraged to develop their own artistic style and the range of projects allow for individual choice and personal development. Teaching time is six periods per fortnight.

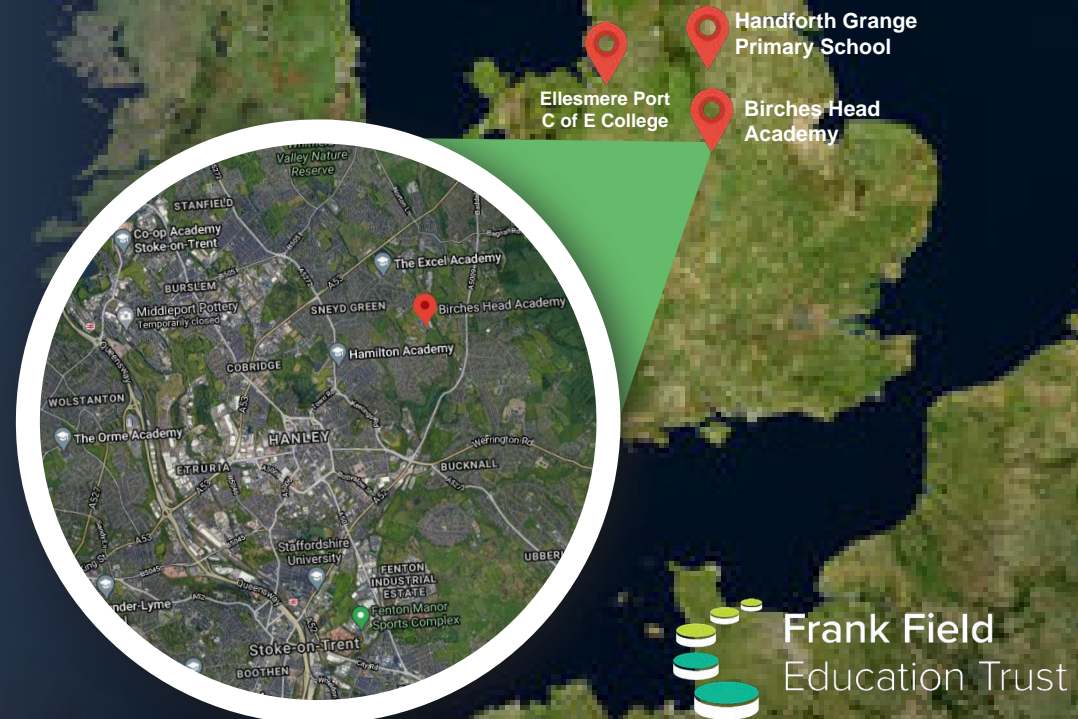
Handforth Grange Primary School
