THE DEPARTMENT

The Art department at Warlingham School is a lively, creative and successful department which is staffed by a team of highly qualified teachers. There are four specialist Art rooms which are well equipped and resourced with projectors in each room and printing presses, equipment for batik and ceramics available.

Art and Design is taught to all students in KS3 over a 2-week timetable in mixed ability groups. The curriculum offers a broad range of experiences and processes including painting and drawing, block and lino printing, appliqué, batik, graphic design, and 3-dimensional work including ceramics.

The uptake for GCSE Art and Design is very popular and the results over the years have been very good. We see a high level of achievement in all areas of Art and Design. At A Level we offer three courses; Art and Design, Art/Textiles and Digital Photography. Many students choose to study two or more of these courses and the vast majority continue their studies in Art Colleges across the country. At the end of each year we hold a large and impressive exhibition of the best work from all the GCSE and A level courses. We believe in celebrating the students' achievements and have invested in framing and displaying their work around the school and creating an online gallery on the school website which shows work from all Key Stages.

The Art department runs a number of after school clubs to support the students in their coursework. There are also clubs and workshops run by other artists and groups including a one-day life drawing workshop run by the Royal Academy of Art for the A Level student. We encourage students to visit Art galleries as much as possible and we organise a number of visits throughout the year.

The quality and well-being of the staff are crucial to the success of our students. Our teachers and support staff are dedicated to helping all students to discover and develop their abilities and talents positively and constructively and enabling individuals to achieve more than they ever thought possible.
