JOB DESCRIPTION



Key responsibilities will include:

- General maintenance of all Art and Photography equipment ensuring all rooms are stocked, paper and fabric cut to size, sink areas are tidy, dark room set up and camera / laptop cupboard is organized and locked etc.
- Maintain stock level of equipment. Re-order stock in good time. Pre-empt any equipment requirements relating to new schemes of work.
- Supporting with all Department Ordering of equipment: Check off all deliveries against orders. Record a running total and maintain up to date pupil purchase record for the department.
- Display ensure all departmental display boards in all rooms and corridor are well maintained and displays are rotated regularly. Backing paper/borders/plastic displaycoverings.
- Support any school events that involve the Art and Photography department and liaising with
 other departments: Christmas concerts displays/drama productions/arts week/ art exhibitions etc.
 This may involve a variety of tasks including sending invites/refreshments/scenery
 painting/displaying work etc.
- General organisation for examinations. Organise signage, display room changes, label desks, organise equipment etc.
- Assist with Art and Photography club: organise resources for clubs that are run by HOD/teaching staff
- Photocopying/resource gathering/laminating.
- Tidy Art and Photography rooms, emptying drying racks, clean sink area, clear computer areas and from rooms
- Maintain all centralised teaching resources/schemes of work/ paperwork etc.
- Liaise with maintenance staff about any repair work needed.
- Maintain and check camera equipment ensuring all batteries are charged.
- Maintain the running of the darkroom, ensuring all chemicals are mixed when needed and ensure all booths are fit for purpose.
- A knowledge and understanding of the darkroom process is desirable but not essential.
- A knowledge of Screen-Printing process is desirable but not essential (Training can be provided in house)
- Experience or knowledge of 2D design, the laser cutter and adobe photoshop would desirable but not essential (Training can be provided in house)

1. Other duties

- To participate in in-service training as deemed appropriate for professional development.
- To support school functions as directed by the head of Art and Photography.
- To participate in appropriate meetings with colleagues, parents etc. relative to the above responsibilities and duties.
- To participate in Performance Management and appraisal and review arrangements.
- Carrying out any other duties which may reasonably be assigned by the Head of Art and Photography.

All duties and responsibilities must be carried out with due regard to the school's Health and Safety Policy.
