The Board of Directors and CSEL seek to appoint an enthusiastic and inspirational Assistant Director of School Improvement (Primary) to provide strategic improvement, and leadership support and challenge for Early Years, KS1 and KS2 areas across our collaborative group schools.

The core purpose of this new opportunity will be to:

- Ensure that standards of achievement, specifically primary and middle schools are of the highest quality and continue to raise standards of education, sharing best practice throughout.
- To secure the maximum standards of high impact training and professional development as a key lever for school improvement for other leaders, teaching and support staff.
- To lead and direct weekly primary Headteacher meetings alongside the other Assistant Director of School Improvement (Primary)
- To be part of the half termly round table review process lead by the Director of School Improvement
- To manage weekly Keeping in Touch meetings with designated Headteachers
- To co-ordinate the deployment of external support for the schools, to lead the quality assurance of the working groups in the sector and to plan and implement a talent management framework.
- To be the key primary lead for Ofsted and \$48 inspections in the Magnificat schools, including Deep Dive lesson visits with inspectors.
- To provide targeted support for under performing schools to raise standards.
- To ensure statutory, safeguarding, and other agreed accountabilities are effectively implemented and lead to improved outcomes for young people, robust compliance and best practice.
- To draw on the person, life and teachings of Jesus Christ to deliver a shared vision and strategic plan, which inspires and motivates pupils, employees and members of the community. The vision should explore Gospel values, moral purpose and be inclusive of stakeholders' values and beliefs.
