Academic Excellence

2020 continued our record of excellent examination outcomes at both GCSE and A Level. Headline figures include:

GCSE

- 81% of students achieved 5 GCSEs including English and Maths at level 4+
- 36% of all grades were at level 7 or higher

A Level

• 75% of grades at A* - B and 47% at A* - A

These results place the school amongst the highest performing comprehensives in the country and are testament to the remarkable quality of the teaching our students receive and their hard working, positive attitude.

The Curriculum

At Malmesbury School our students follow a broad and balanced curriculum which allows them to develop a wide range of skills and personal qualities. Our curriculum is constantly under review in our bid to meet the changing learning needs of all our students.

In Year 7, all students study the following subjects:

- English
- Mathematics
- Science
- Geography
- History
- Religious Studies
- Design and Technology
- Computing
- Languages (either French and Spanish or French and German)
- Art
- Drama
- Dance
- Music
- ILearn (PSHE, Citizenship and Learning to Learn)
- PE

In Year 9, students will begin work which will lead to GCSEs or vocational qualifications in some curriculum areas. Amongst these are English, Maths, Languages, Science and Humanities subjects. Students will also make choices about the optional subjects they would like to study to GCSE in Year 10 along with the compulsory subjects of English Language, English Literature, Maths, two or three science qualifications and core PE. At Key Stage 4 there is a wide range of subjects to choose from as well as a fantastic vocational offer. Please see our Year 10 curriculum offer booklet for more information.











Extra-Curricular Activities and Enrichment

There is a broad range of extra-curricular activities at Malmesbury School which supports the personal growth and development of our students outside the classroom.

We offer a wide variety of extracurricular sports from rugby and hockey to archery and wildlife club. Students also have the opportunity to become involved in drama productions and concerts and each year they amaze us with their talents. Students regularly take part in theatre, music and art trips.

We also provide an outstanding range of opportunities for students to travel and benefit from experiencing other cultures. There



are exchange visits to France, Germany and Spain and an annual ski trip. In 2019 we took a group of students to Northern India/the Himalayas as part of a Global Action Expedition. Plans are well underway for a trip to Zanzibar next summer. In the past we have taken regular trips to South Africa. We have a partner school in China and have been delighted to take students there as well as host a number of Chinese and Japanese students here.

Malmesbury School is proud of its Fairtrade School status. Students from across the School work together to ensure the status is awarded year after year. It is representative of a wider compassion and enthusiasm demonstrated by students in their fund raising for charities and



campaigning on environmental and political issues. We have a very active Eco Schools team in school, and we are involved in the local Model United Nations competition each year and support a number of international charitable projects.



Student Support and Guidance

Malmesbury School is proud of the quality of the pastoral support available to its students. This begins with good liaison with all partner primary schools and a successful induction programme for Year 6 students. It remains a constant feature of school



life with a dedicated Student Support Office, committed tutors, Senior Pastoral Leaders and Academic Leaders.

Tutor Groups

The students are organised into mixed ability tutor groups after detailed discussions with primary school staff. Great care is taken to achieve a mix of abilities and a harmonious balance of friendship groups.

The size of the tutor groups varies from year to year depending on the number of students coming to Malmesbury School. At present there are nine groups in Year 7. These groups will stay together until the end of Year 11.

Activities during tutor registration vary from assemblies to quizzes, debates and silent reading, not to mention the popular unform and equipment checks!





Are all lessons taught in tutor groups?

In Year 7, students will be taught in mixed ability tutor groups for most of their subjects. In Technology, smaller groups are created for workshop situations and in PE tutor groups are mixed up for single sex sports. As the tutor group moves through the school, there will be setting arrangements in various subjects. Maths will set the students in the first term of Year 7.

What are the roles of the tutor, Senior Pastoral Leader and Academic Leader?

Tutor

Your child's tutor will be a central figure in their school lives. The form tutor will meet your child at registration daily and may teach them as well. Routine administration, for example notes of absence, should be sent to the tutor.

Senior Pastoral Leader (SPL)

The Senior Pastoral Leader is responsible for the pastoral care and behavioural support of all students. We have four Senior Pastoral Leaders at school, each with responsibility for different year groups: Transition and Year 7, Years 8 and 9, Years 10 and 11 and Sixth Form.

The Academic Leader (AL)

The Academic Leader is responsible for monitoring the academic progress of your child and arranging appropriate interventions to support their learning. We have an Academic Leader supporting each year group throughout the school including in the Sixth Form.

Counselling

We employ two fully qualified counsellors who cover the whole week between them.







Houses

There are four houses at Malmesbury School. The houses consist of students from across all year groups and each tutor group is allocated to one of the four houses:

- Athelstan
- Eilmer
- Hobbes
- William

Throughout the year, there are a number of opportunities for all students to participate in inter-house competitions and fundraising events as well as working with older students in their house. In addition, students' hard work is rewarded with house points throughout the year. The points are awarded to students for participation in competitions and for outstanding work and contributions to the school and community.



The School Day

The day at Malmesbury School is structured in two ways, depending on whether your child has 1hour or 1.5hour lessons. During the course of the week, your child will have days where they follow either of the following timetables:

Learning Support

The school believes that support work should be organised in such a way that it is available first and foremost to students who transfer from our feeder Primary Schools on the Special Educational Needs and Disability Code of Practice.

Referrals to the Learning Support Faculty can be made by tutors, subject teachers, parents and students themselves. Assistance is available in such areas as reading, study skills, spelling, handwriting, comprehension and mathematical processes.

Students with learning difficulties and disabilities are educated as far as possible alongside their peer group. They are also members of mainstream tutor groups. As a direct result of this, the Faculty offers three types of support.



Curriculum support

Strategies and appropriate materials are used to help all students in the class to understand and respond positively to the lesson.

In class support

A teaching assistant works alongside the subject teacher in the classroom. This is to the benefit of all students.

Out of class support

Help is provided on a withdrawal basis, usually at a regular allotted time. This is designed to meet specific student needs as they arise or overcome a particular learning obstacle.



Sixth Form

We have a thriving and highly successful sixth form with excellent facilities and an exceptional track record of academic success at A Level. We offer a wide range of approximately 26 A Level courses alongside our Excellence Programme. This is a bespoke enrichment programme designed to further develop the student beyond their academic potential. At the heart of this is the Advocacy Scheme. Students volunteer in a variety of in-school opportunities such as peer mentoring, paired reading or in-class support; working with students in lower year groups or interacting with local community groups.



In addition to advocacy, students receive regular one to one support from their tutor and can also study from a range of additional courses such the Extended Project, Diploma of Finance, Core Maths, a language and PE including yoga. Tutoring is at the heart of supporting our

students. Around 90% of our Year 13 apply successfully to university each year but for some, support from the tutor and career advisor is essential when pursuing an apprenticeship or employment. Large numbers of students go on to the very best universities each year including 62% to Russell Group universities in 2020.

Facilities in the Sixth form area are excellent. We regularly receive feedback from our students and look for ways to improve. In recent years this has seen an increase in space and the addition of a servery in the common room, a refit to increase quiet study space, three new teaching rooms and a 'chill out' space.
