You must be capable of providing inspirational leadership, be creative, an outstanding classroom practitioner and have an innovative and flexible approach to finding solutions which will enable young people to be safe, respectful and ready to learn on a daily basis. You will be committed to the highest achievement for all and be a resourceful and enthusiastic member of the senior team. You will have a trauma informed approach to managing a child's provision; be a restorative practitioner; and use nurture principles to inform your, and others', daily practice.
