


Ethos and values

Curriculum

We aim to equip our students for the modern world: we are experiencing rapid economic, political and social change and our students need to be ready to take their place in that world. For example, we introduced Mandarin and joined the Mandarin Excellence Programme last year in order to provide our students with additional challenge. We are carefully reviewing our curriculum, paying close attention to what we want students to know, understand and do, especially at KS3. We are working on developing a truly academically rigorous, knowledge rich curriculum that is challenging, engaging and stimulating, and supports students to think for themselves. We cannot work on pedagogy in isolation of curriculum. Curriculum intent and implementation ie teaching and learning are integrally related and the successful candidate will work closely with the core Senior Team and with Middle Leaders to further develop these areas.

We have worked closely with an Independent Education Consultant and Trainer to develop curriculum and pedagogy. Our curriculum teams are focusing on the key knowledge, skills and concepts that students need to gain mastery in their disciplines and are working carefully on sequencing of core knowledge and skills. We aim to be leaders in innovative curriculum design and pedagogy over the coming years.


In addition to our core academic curriculum and in keeping with our ethos, we have designed a Magis curriculum at KS3 to teach explicitly a range of skills such as emotional literacy and intelligence, keeping good mental health, teamwork, positive relationships, dealing with conflict and compromise, self belief, self management and interpersonal skills in order to develop a positive, caring masculinity. We draw upon the Upenn Resilience programme to guide us, a programme designed to develop emotional resilience and wellbeing.

Teaching and learning, and staff development

We are striving to be a community where there is a genuine passion and excitement about how students learn and how teachers teach, where teachers' practice is research and evidence based, and risk taking is the norm, where teachers are learners, collaborating with and developing one another. We believe that we can only change practice by ensuring that teachers have the opportunity to reflect, challenge and support one another. We are moving away from traditional lesson observations where a lesson is observed and judged as we do not believe that this is developmental or changes practice. We undertake regular learning walks to capture good practice, promote peer observation and film lessons so that colleagues can analyse their own practice and take responsibility for their own practice before meeting to have a professional dialogue.

Staff are our most valuable resource and we invest in them, making time for staff development. Every Wednesday, we have our teaching and learning briefing and most of our training takes place in weekly Professional Thursdays from 3.20 – 4.40pm. Staff work collaboratively in groups on areas of practice grounded in research and development such as digital transformation, checking understanding, scaffolding etc. In the next few months, we will gain the status of being a speech, language and communication friendly school as a significant proportion of our staff are now ELKLAN trained. We work closely with colleagues in our Teaching Alliance and our staff have access to a range of middle and senior leadership programmes as well as the Olevi Outstanding Teacher Programme but we find that some of our best CPD is delivered in school.

The successful candidate will work with our core team of Senior Leaders focused on developing curriculum, teaching and learning, and staff, and will lead our Teaching and Learning Team and Lead Practitioners, planning and delivering our training. We are evaluative and self-reflective and work with other schools to undertake peer to peer review led by our Independent Education Consultant. We aim to be known for our dynamic teaching and learning.
