About JFK Special School

We are a special school with dedicated sites for profound and multiple learning difficulties (PMLD) and autism spectrum conditions (ASC), full of fantastic, vibrant and incredibly talented students. Our dedicated and highly skilled staff team are passionate about supporting our pupils and each other. Their constant focus on finding new ways to meet our mission statement of enhancing life through learning is a source of inspiration, and something that makes us very proud.



Covering ages 5-19 we emphasise the importance of communication skills and increasing independence through engaging activities and a class structure that allows us to personalise each student's learning journey to fit their individual sensory, behaviour, communication, medical and learning needs.

Stratford site offers specialist provision for up to 60 students with sensory and medical needs. This site is equipped with sensory and soft play rooms, hydrotherapy, as well as large classrooms equipped with tracking hoists and outdoor equipment for students who are more independently mobile.

Beckton site offers specialist teaching and learning for up to 50 students with autism and communication needs. This site has developed its outdoors space and use of local facilities to support independence and life skills and offers a structured teaching and learning approach.

Our site at North Woolwich caters for up to 18 younger students with autism and communication needs. The site features large classrooms, lots of outdoor space for exploration and specialist therapy rooms.

We aim to work in partnership with parents and other professionals as well as enhancing our links in our local community and beyond. And as a founding member of the Learning in Harmony Trust and with our Teaching School Alliance status we also seek to outwardly support other schools in our region in areas of specialist provision and teaching. We know that a collaborative approach is the only way to ensure the best possible opportunities and outcomes for all learners.
