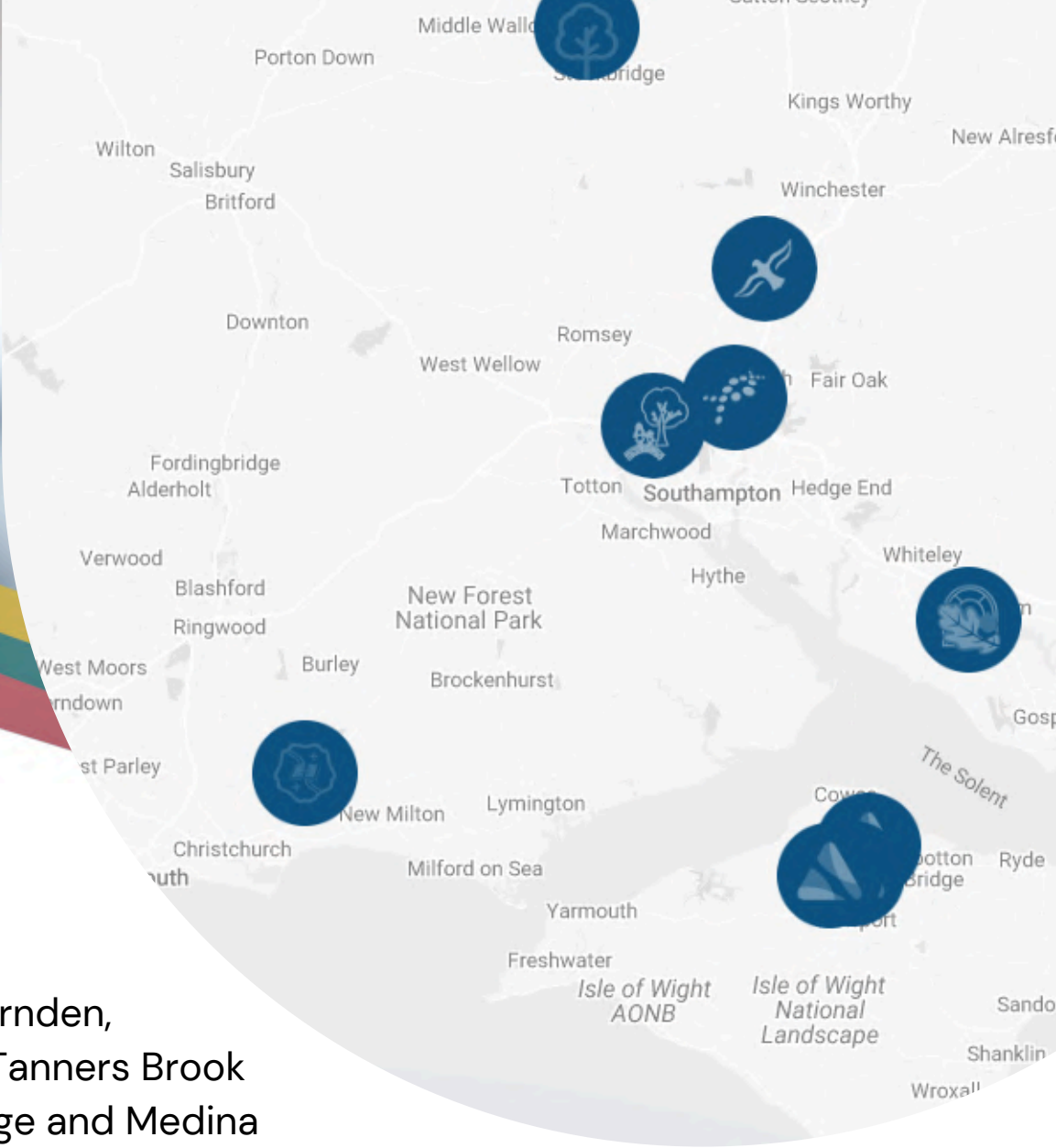

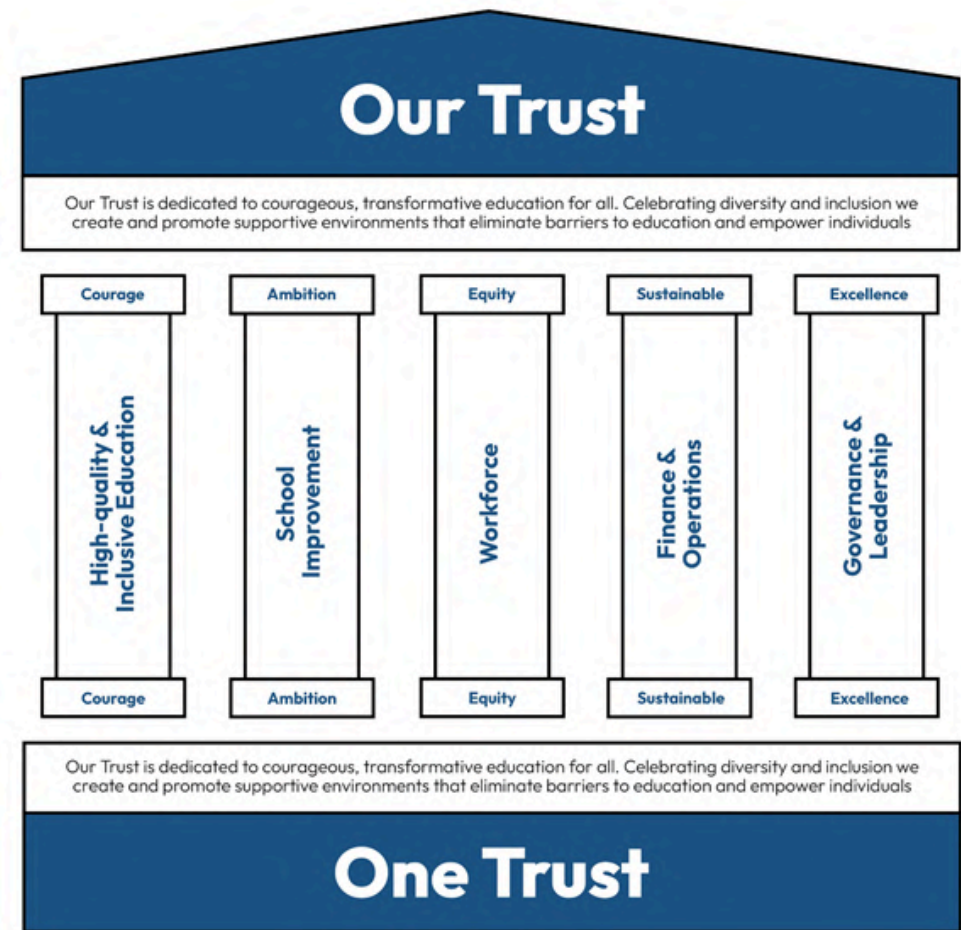
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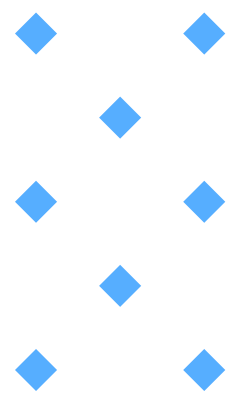
Our Trust, One Trust: HISP Multi Academy Trust

We now have eight schools: Thornden, Highcliffe, Danebury and Crofton Secondary Schools, and Portswood and Tanners Brook Primary Schools, joined on 1 July 2024 by Isle of Wight's Carisbrooke College and Medina College (including VI Form). 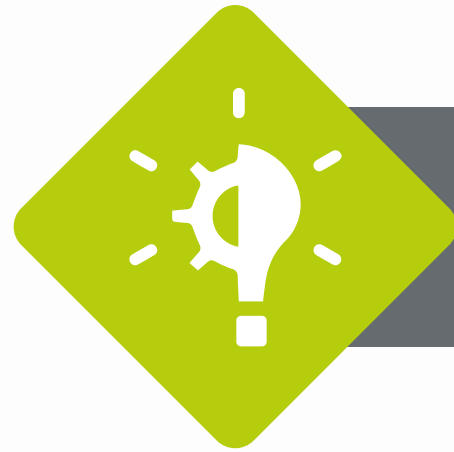

Careers and Employability

Pathways

Provide support for students applying for courses other than via UCAS, as well as alternative pathways such as apprenticeships.

Transition

Support with the organisation of VI Form taster days for KS4 as well as providing KS3 students with an experience of post 16 education to support them making informed choices. Lead on the coordination of the transition from Year 11 including assisting the Head of VI Form with conducting interviews for Year 11 students and parents.

UCAS, Oxbridge, Medicine...

Oversee and lead on the UCAS process for Years 12 and 13, and post A Level cohort. Lead and organise the VI Form Higher Education programme, building relationships with university admissions tutors, apprenticeship providers and raising the awareness of Years 10 and 11 students of the criteria for university entry. Lead on the Oxbridge, Medical, Dentistry and Veterinary programmes.
