Duties and responsibilities

Key tasks

1. To develop the long and medium-term planning for key areas of the science curriculum taking into account the school's strategic vision
2. To support the Learning Leader to evaluate the effectiveness of Science
3. To track and monitor the progress of key areas within Science, and report this regularly to the Learning Leader; to ensure effective interventions are in place to raise standards for under-achievers
4. To ensure that the needs of students with English as an Additional Language, Special Educational Needs or DV students are met within Science
5. Under the direction of the Learning Leader, to ensure that accurate and robust assessment of students is in place in Science
6. To work with the Learning Leader to maintain appropriate CPD for the staff teaching Science
7. To ensure that a positive climate for learning is evident in key areas in Science
8. To contribute to pastoral curriculum when appropriate
9. To ensure that students within Science have a voice
10. To contribute to the school improvement through the weekly CPT meeting
11. To support the transition of students from primary school in Science
12. To be a form tutor
