Harris academies are funded on the same basis as other state schools in England, but by negotiating shared contracts and services, and delivering other economies of scale, our academies save over £5m per year, all of which goes back into the education of our students.

As part of the central team we have more than 70 consultants, each a subject specialist and highly-skilled teachers who are available to our academies as a resource to use as they need. Their job is to create curriculum excellence in every subject. Our schools are able to access their full support to ensure the most effective curriculum intent, implementation, and impact.

# Main Areas of Responsibility

## Behaviour for Learning

- Be a role model for students, inspiring and supporting them to be the best version of themselves and grow into responsible adulthood.
- Establish positive professional relationships with students using methods to encourage student engagement.
- Support students in the development of the 'Clapham Character' (courage, confidence, commitment) and in ensuring the highest standards of behaviour, in line with the Behaviour for Learning policy.
- Support and mentor key groups of students to enable them meet academic expectations, including setting high expectations, monitoring attendance and punctuality and support with managing workload.
- Work with and support Heads of House in upholding high standards of attendance and punctuality, academic achievement and the Clapham Character.
- Liaise with parents / carers, involving and informing them of their child's achievement, attendance and progress.
- Liaise with teachers, sharing key information and strategies to support key students.
- Work in partnership with other practitioners to deliver effective interventions and support for children and families.
- Support a calm and purposeful environment at the academy, including undertaking duties at lunchtime, at the beginning and end of the day and in corridors during the day.
- Manage detentions and follow up on non-attendees.
- Oversee students who have been internally excluded and ensure the time spent is highly focussed and reflective, and covers the relevant curriculum, liaising with teaching staff to ensure appropriate work is set and appropriate provision is in place.
- Liaise with parents/ carers and relevant APs and subject staff to ensure smooth transition to and from internal and external exclusion.
- Ensure that students enter the building in full academy uniform and if not, following the agreed procedures.
- Ensure that follow up action is taken, in collaboration with the Head of House, for students failing to meet academy standards.
- Follow through any issues to do with behaviour as required by the academy leadership group, for example, taking student statements regarding incidents and passing these on to relevant colleagues.
- Present reports of students' progress to review meetings.
- Ensure that all issues that relate to student safety such as allegations of bullying are passed on to academy colleagues, in a timely manner, for further investigation as required.
- Act as the liaison between the academy and the local community and other agencies where appropriate.

### **Attendance & Punctuality.**

- Liaise with the Attendance Officer to support monitoring of students on attendance report.
- Ensure that designated mentored students have up-to-date report cards and that completed cards are filed appropriately.
- To assist the Academy Leadership Group in maintaining the highest standards of attendance and punctuality to lessons.
- Maintain a corridor presence to ensure students attend lessons punctually.
- Oversee the entrance of students into the building after 8.50 am.
- Follow up on any truancy concerns.

### **Organisation & Communication**

- Organisation of meetings with parents/carers, documentation, confirmation when requested by the Vice Principal.
- Communication with parents/carers.
- Contact with home to follow up reasons for absence.

### **Other Duties**

- To be role models for the students of the academy, including upholding the Clapham Character.
- Under the direction of the academy leadership group, undertake such other tasks that may be required to further the efficient running of the academy, commensurate with the level of the post holder.
- To participate in academy trips/visits when requested.
- To be responsible for own professional development, identifying training needs and requesting courses as appropriate.

### **Academy Ethos**

- To engage actively in the performance review process, addressing appraisal targets set by the line manager each autumn term.
- To promote equal opportunities and celebrate diversity in all aspects of the academy.
- To play a full part in the life of the academy community, to support its distinctive aim and ethos and to encourage staff and students to follow this example.
- To promote actively the academy's corporate policies.
- To comply with the academy's Health and Safety policy and undertake risk assessments as appropriate.
- To show a record of excellent attendance and punctuality.
- To adhere to the academy's Dress Code.
