Teaching

- Deliver the curriculum as relevant to the age and ability group/subject/s that you teach

- Demonstrate an understanding of and take responsibility for promoting high standards of literacy
- If teaching early reading, demonstrate a clear understanding of appropriate teaching strategies
- Use an appropriate range of observation, assessment, monitoring and recording strategies as a basis
 for setting challenging learning objectives for pupils of all backgrounds, abilities and dispositions,
 monitoring learners' progress and levels of attainment
- Make accurate and productive use of assessment to secure pupils' progress
- Give pupils regular feedback, both orally and through accurate marking, and encourage pupils to respond to the feedback, reflect on progress, their emerging needs and to take a responsible and conscientious attitude to their own work and study
- Use relevant data to monitor progress, set targets, and plan subsequent lessons
- Set homework and plan other out-of-class activities to consolidate and extend the knowledge and understanding pupils have acquired as appropriate
- Participate in arrangements for examinations and assessments within the remit of the School Teachers'
 Pay and Conditions Document

Behaviour and Safety

- Establish a safe, purposeful and stimulating environment for pupils, rooted in mutual respect and establish a framework for discipline with a range of strategies, using praise, sanctions and rewards consistently and fairly
- Manage classes effectively, using approaches which are appropriate to pupils' needs in order to inspire, motivate and challenge pupils
- Maintain good relationships with pupils, exercise appropriate authority, and act decisively when necessary

- Take part as required in the review, development and management of the activities relating to the curriculum, organisation and pastoral functions of the school
