Class Teacher Job Description

JOB TITLE: Class Teacher

You are required to carry out the duties of a school teacher as set out in the School Teachers' Pay and Conditions document, have a secure knowledge and understanding of all subjects taught and have due regard to the requirements of the National Curriculum, Early Years Foundation Stage, agreed syllabus for R.E, the School's Aims, Schemes of Work and any polices of the LA and Governing Body.

Class Teacher Responsibility

- To be responsible for the care, education and development of a class of children and understand that pupil's learning is affected by their physical, intellectual, emotional and social development.
- To create a safe, stimulating classroom learning environment allowing children to develop independence and become confident learners.
- ♣ To plan effectively to ensure that pupils have the opportunity to meet their potential, notwithstanding differences of race and gender, and taking account of the needs of pupils who are: underachieving, very able, not yet fluent in English; making use of relevant information and specialist help where available.
- To secure and sustain effective teaching of the relevant subjects for individuals, groups and classes by using appropriate teaching and learning strategies that are appropriate to the children's age, aptitude and ability, communicating clear learning objectives and expectations to ensure that lessons planned maximise progression in pupil's learning.
- To identify the particular needs of a child, through on-going and planned assessments and set targets for pupils' learning, building on prior attainment, and ensuring that pupils are aware of the content and purpose of what they are asked to do.
- To plan effectively, where applicable, to meet the needs of pupils with Special Educational Needs and in collaboration with the SENCo, make an appropriate contribution to the preparation, implementation, monitoring and review of Individual Support Plans.
- To take appropriate account of ethnic and cultural diversity to enrich the curriculum and raise achievement.
- To have regard for preparation, marking, display and record keeping both in line with LA. and school policies, guidelines and timetables.
- To supervise children in the playground at playtime on an agreed rota.

To fully participate in weekly staff meetings and assemblies where appropriate and be ready to share work with others.

To participate in meetings at school relating to the curriculum, administration and organisation of

the school.

↓ To be prepared to run an after school extra-curricular club. (Not ECTs)

♣ To participate in arrangements for Appraisal in schools. (Not ECTs)

4 To establish positive links with the school Governors and to be aware of the role and purpose of

school governing bodies.

♣ To be prepared to teach the complete age range of the school and offering a stable, caring

environment where children are encouraged to progress in a calm, structured atmosphere.

Managing and Working with People

To lead, manage and work collaboratively with pupils and as appropriate, with other adults and

colleagues.

To secure a good standard of pupil behaviour in the classroom through establishing appropriate rules and high expectations of discipline which pupils respect, acting to pre-empt and deal with

inappropriate behaviour in the context of the behaviour policy of the school.

To where applicable, deploy other adults effectively in the classroom, involving them, where

appropriate, in the planning and management of pupils' learning.

To work as a member of a team, planning co-operatively, sharing information, ideas and expertise.

To liaise effectively with pupils' parents/carers through parents evenings and informative oral and written reports on pupils' progress and achievements, discussing appropriate targets and

encouraging them to support their children's learning, behaviour and progress.

♣ To treat in confidence information concerning individual children and families disclosed to you

whilst the child is in your care.

To take responsibility for own professional development, setting objectives for improvements and

take action to keep up-to-date with research and developments in pedagogy and in the subject(s)

taught.
