- Contribute to the development, implementation, and review of the KS2 curriculum.
- Ensure statutory requirements for assessment and reporting are met.
- Manage and utilise teaching assistants and other **support staff** effectively within the classroom.

3. Pastoral Care and Ethos

- Build strong relationships founded on trust, kindness, and friendship with pupils, staff, and parents/carers.
- Uphold the school's positive, welcoming, and values-led culture built on mutual respect.
- Implement the school's **behaviour policy** consistently and fairly.
- Actively promote the welfare and safeguarding of children in line with school and Trust policy.
