- **Assess, record, and report on the development, progress, and attainment of pupils.**
- **Monitor and respond to dysregulation and behaviours of concern, using reflective practice to increase pupil regulation and engagement.**
- **Collaborate with external agencies to ensure best practice and implement recommendations effectively.**
- **Support the SENCo with SSPP and EHCP applications, reviews and ongoing assessments.**
- **Provide outreach guidance and support to class teachers across the school to strengthen inclusive practice.**

We are looking for a teacher who is:

- **Skilled in adapting teaching approaches to support a range of SEND needs.**
- **Reflective, resilient and proactive in seeking the best outcomes for pupils.**
