JOB TITLE - CLASS TEACHER

RESPONSIBLE TO - THE HEADTEACHER

GENERAL DESCRIPTION - Class Teachers are responsible for all aspects of the education, supervision, welfare and safeguarding of a class of children. This will involve preparing and delivering a broad, balanced relevant curriculum for pupils and working with parents and other professionals to facilitate the meeting of the whole child's needs.

Responsibilities and main duties

1. <u>To children</u> To be a class teacher to a group of pupils with learning difficulties

- 1. To plan and timetable activities that ensures a breadth, balance and relevance of curriculum, is delivered to a group and individuals.
- 2. To set termly goals for each child.
- 3. To maintain agreed school records and plans.
- 4. To service each child's annual review with reports, attendance etc.
- 5. To plan and facilitate out of school experiences and integration opportunities.
- 6. Appraise the head teacher of any major developments.

2. To parents To work closely with parents in all aspects of the child's life.

- 1. To keep parents fully informed by the use of home/school books, home visits, phone calls etc.
- 2. To jointly negotiate termly goals with parents.
- 3. To regularly invite parents into school.

3. <u>To other professionals</u> To work closely with other involved parties, liaising, co-ordinating and supervising where necessary.

- 1. To organise the work of classroom assistants, recognising the school's requirement that teaching assistants and teachers work as a team.
- 2. To liaise with health authority therapists and execute jointly negotiated programmes.
- 3. To liaise and co-operate with external agencies (like social services and voluntary bodies).
- 4. To attend weekly teachers meeting, monthly whole staff meetings and curriculum planning and departmental meetings as arranged.
- 5. Take an agreed share of organisational/management/ administrative duties.
- 6. Help in training new staff, students and volunteers and accommodate visitors when necessary.

4. To your own development

- 1. Participate in any induction the school arranges for you.
- 2. Take an active part in the school's school focussed staff development programme.
- 3. Read journals and attend courses that will enhance your own knowledge and development.
- 4. Join the Headteacher in regular discussions about progress and new developments.
