**Full-time Teacher (MPS1-MPS3) – KS1 pupils with severe learning disabilities (may suit Early Careers Teacher)**

**Both positions attract a SEN1 allowance**

Glyne Gap School has been rated as 'outstanding' in its last five Ofsted inspections. We are fortunate in having hard working and inspiring pupils as well as an exceptional staff who have achieved very high standards in an atmosphere of fun and mutual support. The school believes in it being a place where everyone is treated with dignity, respect and is of equal worth.

The pupils are certainly the very best thing about our school and our main aim is to teach them the knowledge, skills and confidence that will enable their happy and fulfilled lives now and in the future. All our pupils have a severe/profound learning disability and our curriculum focusses on their priority learning: communication and personal development.

The school believes that we must strive to make pupils successful in their learning and that we can best do this by providing carefully structured programmes, working closely with parents and celebrating their achievements.

The school is organised into three departments – Lower School, Upper School and FE. Classes are arranged to provide a progression for all pupils passing through the school, with two to three years being the usual time spent in any one class.

The Further Education Department (Faculty) is situated half a mile away from the school.

The Nursery is located adjacent to Pebsham School (which shares a site with Glyne Gap School). It is a purpose-built building which educates 6 Glyne Gap pupils with 20 mainstream pupils in a fully inclusive way.

The school has a number of specialist staff including its own Communication Team, PE Teacher and Yoga Teacher. They all work in direct co-operation and consultation with the pupil's class teacher to ensure that there is a balanced curriculum and that priority needs are worked on by all. We also work alongside health and care colleagues including therapists.
