- Adapt teaching and learning experiences to respond to the strengths and needs of all pupils, including those who have Special Educational Needs and / or are higher achieving
- Set high expectations which inspire, motivate and challenge pupils
- Demonstrate good subject and curriculum knowledge, taking responsibility for continuing professional development
- Manage behavior effectively to ensure a positive learning environment for all children

Whole School organisation, strategy and development

- Contribute to the development, implementation and evaluation of the school's policies, practices and procedures, so as to support the school's Mission, Vision and Aims
- Establish and maintain positive and professional relationships with all members of staff and staff from across the SWAN Trust
- Make a positive contribution to the wider life and ethos of the school
- Work with others on curriculum and pupil development to ensure the school is continually improving
- Foster good relationships with parents and encourage their involvement in classroom and home support
- Work in co-operation with members of the Local Governing Committee
