- E1 Experience of teaching in Early Years, Key stage One or Key Stage Two.
- Experience of supporting pupils with additional learning needs, including Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND), emotional or social challenges and/or English as an additional language (EAL).
- E3 Experience of supporting pupils to access and engage with the primary curriculum, including learning strategies which stretch and challenge all pupils.

- S1 Ability to identify the key elements of excellent teaching, demonstrating awareness of its impact.
- S2 Ability to reflect on their own teaching, making changes to improve their own teaching.
- S3 Strong classroom management skills which create a positive and productive learning environment.

- S4 Use of modelling, facilitating and giving effective feedback to support high-quality learning.
