Set high expectations which inspire, motivate and challenge staff and pupils	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Possess the ability to lead, motivate and inspire confidence • Be able successfully to implement strategies for raising achievement and ensuring effective teaching and learning • Establish a safe and stimulating environment for pupils, rooted in mutual respect • Set goals that stretch and challenge pupils of all backgrounds, abilities and dispositions • Demonstrate consistently the positive attitudes, values and behaviour which are expected of pupils
Promote good pupil progress and outcomes	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Be accountable for pupils' attainment, progress and outcomes • Plan teaching to build on pupil's capabilities and their prior knowledge • Guide pupils to reflect on the progress they have made and their emerging needs • Demonstrate knowledge and understanding of how pupils learn and how this impacts on teaching • Encourage pupils to take a responsible and conscientious attitude to their own work and study
Demonstrate good subject knowledge	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Have a secure knowledge of the relevant subject(s) and curriculum areas, foster and maintain pupils' interest and address misunderstandings • Demonstrate a critical understanding of developments in all subjects and curriculum areas and promote the value of scholarship • Demonstrate an understanding of and take responsibility for promoting high standards of literacy and the correct use of standard English, whatever the teacher's specialist subject • When teaching, demonstrate a clear understanding of appropriate teaching strategies

Make accurate and productive use of assessment	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Know and understand how to assess the relevant subject and curriculum areas, including statutory assessment requirements • Make use of formative and summative assessment to secure pupil progress • Use relevant data to monitor progress, set targets and plan subsequent lessons • Give pupils regular feedback both orally and through accurate marking, and encourage pupils to respond to the feedback

<p>Manage behaviour effectively to ensure a good and safe learning environment</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Have clear rules and routines for behaviour in classrooms, and take responsibility for promoting good and courteous behaviour both in classrooms and around the school, in accordance with the school's behaviour policy • Have high expectations of behaviour and establish a framework for discipline with a range of strategies, using praise, sanctions and rewards consistently and fairly • Manage classes effectively using approaches which are appropriate to pupils needs in order to involve and motivate them
