The successful candidate will be a Dance or Drama specialist, but will also have a passion for expressive arts more broadly, and will be excited by the opportunities of leading a multidisciplinary team.

The successful applicant will have a sharp understanding of what quality-first planning and teaching looks like, the emotional intelligence required to coach and grow others, and an unswerving commitment to ensuring the very best possible outcomes for students. They will be dedicated to bring the Performing Arts to life for students both within lessons and beyond them, through opportunities such as productions, clubs and competitions.

The Curriculum Leader for Performing Arts role at King's Academy Easthampstead Park is regarded as a senior curriculum leadership position, and as a result, comes with additional non-contact time for the Curriculum Leader for Performing Arts to undertake their leadership responsibilities. The successful candidate will be expected to attend leadership meetings and work closely with Senior Leaders and fellow Curriculum Leaders on whole school curriculum leadership.
