

About the Faculty

Maths Faculty

Through high quality teaching and learning, good communication, consistency and mutual respect, the Mathematics Faculty work collaboratively as a team to raise student expectations and maximise achievement. We foster in students an enthusiasm and passion for our subject, inspiring pupils and instilling a desire to succeed and achieve their full potential and beyond in a supportive environment.

The faculty consists of nine mathematics specialists who have worked together as a highly successful, supportive team and, whilst there is a wealth of expertise in the department, we constantly look to further improve the quality of teaching and learning. We develop, evaluate and embrace new initiatives and have an embedded ethos of sharing good practice.

Within the department there are 3 subject TLR responsibilities: a School Director for Mathematics, a Deputy School Director and an Assistant School Director.

A good proportion of the Sixth Form study Mathematics at A level and, in addition to this, we offer Further Mathematics to A2. Due to the continued popularity of this subject post-16 we have seen an increasing number of students studying mathematics at university (including Oxford and Cambridge) and, consequently, we offer timetabled lessons for STEP/AEA paper preparation, again, with a high measure of success.

Resources and Organisation

All 9 teaching rooms are equipped with multi-media screens and a visualiser. We have detailed schemes of work in place for all years with a core text for KS4 and KS5. From September 2022 all of KS3 are following the Ark Mathematics Mastery curriculum and every classroom has a wealth of manipulatives to support the delivery of this. All mathematics classes in KS3 and KS4 are taught in sets according to ability.

The school operates a two week timetable of one hour lessons:

Years 7, 8 and 9 have 6 lessons per fortnight.

Year 10 and 11 have 8 lessons per fortnight.

Year 12 and 13 have 10 lessons per fortnight.

AQA specifications are followed at both GCSE (8300) and A-Level (7357/7367).

There are a number of long established extra-curricular opportunities throughout the week that are staffed, and attended by pupils, in a voluntary capacity. Our after school "surgeries" are always very well attended by the full range of abilities aspiring to improve their understanding, further their potential and become independent learners.

A series of trainee teachers have been successfully introduced to teaching at Allestree Woodlands School, several of whom have gone on to take up posts with us. We also have an established ECT programme.

- · Assist the Director of Maths with their duties and deputise when required.

- To be a Form Tutor, with care and guidance responsibility within the school and contribute to the development and delivery of the personal and social education programme in the year team.
- Take leading role in development and implementation of curriculum in Maths and be involved in evaluation of impact.
- Support the Director of Maths with operational management tasks as required.
- Responsibility for overseeing the delivery of relevant qualifications.
- Promote and develop engagement with STEM within Maths subjects.
- Work in accordance with the statement of the School's Values and Aims and the School's Improvement Plan.

Responsibilities

- The Deputy Director of Maths will be accountable to the School Director of Maths, the Faculty's Senior Team Line Manager and the Headteacher
- Operational management as required.
- Assist the Director of Maths with team development and management.
- Maintain an effective learning environment in and around the curriculum area.
- Undertake monitoring and tracking of pupil progress and implement appropriate intervention and support where required.
- Support and implement systems to improve and manage student behaviour.
- Play a lead role in the sharing of good practice across the curriculum area, including mentoring and coaching colleagues to improve their practice.
- Assist the Director in monitoring the implementation of school policy.
- Development of schemes of work in conjunction with the Director of Maths.
- Ensure that assessment, recording and reporting arrangements are adhered to.
- Assist the Director of Maths in evaluation of the curriculum.
- Resource provision as agreed with the Director.
- Assist the Director of Maths with induction training and development of appropriate staff in the curriculum area.
- Assist the Director of Maths in ensuring effective cover across the faculty when required.
- Work in conjunction with others to deliver effective cross-curricular initiatives, particularly STEAM.
- Research and staying up to date with new courses and programmes that meet the needs of future cohorts.
- Promote and demonstrate the ethos and values of the school particularly the CORE values of courage, optimism, regard and endeavour as attributes we appreciate, and seek to develop.
- \bullet Ensure that relevant team members understand how to meet the needs of students in specialist subject area.
