THE POST

We are looking for an enthusiastic English Early Career Teacher who is committed to their own professional development and would relish the opportunity to begin their career in a high performing English faculty. The successful applicant will teach English up to and including GCSE. A Level teaching may also be available.

Early Career Teachers at Moulsham High School teach a reduced timetable of 40/50 lessons a fortnight in Year 1, and 42/50 in Year 2. They have a subject mentor from within their faculty and are provided with an in-house induction programme led by a member of the Senior Leadership Team. Further support is provided by the Bridge Academy Trust.

This is a full-time post.

THE FACULTY

The English faculty plays a pivotal role in the success of Moulsham High School. It forms part of the school's specialism and is very highly regarded by parents and students alike. Results are consistently exceptional at both GCSE and A-level, but staff are not complacent and are constantly striving for further improvement.

The English faculty is based in a cluster of ten adjacent classrooms. Each classroom has a projector, an interactive whiteboard and is wireless networked. There is also easy access to a bookable resource of 30 computers which are for the sole use of the English faculty. Each member of staff is provided with his/her own laptop.

The faculty's clear and aspirational vision underpins all of its work. Its aspiration is for every student to acquire:

- A lifelong love of language.
- An academic excellence which is commensurate with their ability.
- An empowering command of the written and spoken word.

The opportunities for professional development afforded to staff within the faculty have been considerable and are on-going. In any academic year, teachers are afforded many opportunities tailored to meet their individual needs. These include membership of PIXL/exam board conferences and visits to other English faculties within the Bridge Academy Trust to share good practice.

The successful candidate will join a strong and experienced team of ten specialists, including a member of the Senior Leadership Team. The postholders are:

- Head of Faculty.
- Raising Achievement and Progress Co-ordinator: Years 10 and 11.
- Raising Achievement and Progress Co-ordinator: Years 7 to 9.
- Raising Achievement and Progress Co-ordinator: Key Stage 5.





The faculty often welcomes student teachers from the Mid-Essex School Centered Initial Teacher Training scheme.

ATTAINMENT

The English faculty is highly successful. Standards at all Key Stages have consistently been well above the national averages.

CURRICULUM

YEARS 7, 8 AND 9

In Years 7 to 9 the faculty's schemes of work are broad, balanced and innovative. Students will read and study a wide range of 19th and 20th century texts, both fiction and non-fiction. Summative assessments are formally completed in exam conditions and are designed to develop the skills required by GCSE. Upon entering Moulsham High School, we aim to empower all our students with an expert command of the spoken and written word.

YEARS 10 AND 11

All students take GCSEs in English Language and English literature. The AQA syllabuses are followed. GCSE Media Studies is offered as an option.

YEARS 12 AND 13

As well as A level English Literature, the faculty also offers the OCR A-level in Media Studies and WJEC A Level Film Studies, all with very large uptakes.

ENRICHMENT ACTIVITIES

The English faculty offers a wide variety of enrichment opportunities for students across years 7 to 13. A variety of clubs are offered each week and there are numerous lecture and theatre trips. Many enrichment activities are offered in conjunction with our well-resourced and well-organised library, for example, author visits.
