Job Description: Class Teacher

Responsible To: The Headteacher

Main Responsibilities:

To carry out the duties of a School Teacher as contained in the latest School Teachers' Pay and Conditions

To set high expectations which inspire, motivate and challenge pupils

- establish a safe and stimulating environment for pupils, rooted in mutual respect
- set goals that stretch and challenge pupils of all backgrounds, abilities and dispositions
- demonstrate consistently the positive attitudes, values and behaviour which are expected of pupils

Promote good progress and outcomes by pupils

- be accountable for pupils' attainment, progress and outcomes
- be aware of pupils' capabilities and their prior knowledge, and plan teaching to build on these
- guide pupils to reflect on the progress they have made and their emerging needs
- demonstrate knowledge and understanding of how pupils learn and how this impacts on teaching
- encourage pupils to take a responsible and conscientious attitude to their own work and study

Demonstrate good subject and curriculum knowledge

- have a secure knowledge of statutory National Curriculum requirements for Early Years and KS1
- foster and maintain pupils' interest and address misunderstandings
- demonstrate an understanding of and take responsibility for promoting high standards of literacy, including systematic synthetic phonics and early reading skills
- demonstrate a clear understanding of early mathematics and appropriate teaching strategies

Plan and teach well-structured lessons

- impart knowledge and develop understanding through effective use of lesson time
- promote love of learning and children's intellectual curiosity
- set homework and plan other out-of-class activities to consolidate and extend the knowledge and understanding pupils have acquired
- reflect systematically on the effectiveness of lessons and approaches to teaching
- contribute to the design and provision of an engaging curriculum which meets statutory requirements

Adapt teaching to respond to the strengths and needs of all pupils

- know when and how to differentiate appropriately, using approaches which enable pupils to be taught effectively
- have a secure understanding of how a range of factors can inhibit pupils' ability to learn, and how best to overcome these
- Know how to meet the needs of all learners, including those with SEN and those of high ability, implementing and evaluating teaching approaches to engage and support them





Make accurate and productive use of assessment

- know and understand strategies for monitoring, assessment, recording and reporting pupil progress including statutory assessment requirements
- use relevant data to monitor progress, set targets, and plan subsequent lessons
- give pupils regular feedback, both orally and through accurate marking, and encourage pupils to respond to the feedback.

Manage behaviour effectively to ensure a good and safe learning environment

- implement and reinforce clear behaviour routines, promoting positive behaviour in the classroom and around school, in accordance with the school's behaviour policy
- create a happy, challenging and effective learning environment through high expectations of themselves and the children they teach.
- promote the school's aims and values positively using effective strategies to motivate and include all learners;

Fulfil wider professional responsibilities

- make a positive contribution to the wider life and ethos of the school
- develop effective professional relationships with colleagues, knowing how and when to draw on advice and specialist support
- deploy support staff effectively
- take responsibility for improving teaching through appropriate professional development, responding to advice and feedback from colleagues
- communicate effectively with parents with regard to pupils' achievements and well-being
- establish and develop close relationships with parents, governors and the community;
- Teachers must have proper and professional regard for the ethos, policies and practices of the school in which they teach, and maintain high standards in their own attendance and punctuality.
- having regard for the need to safeguard pupils' well-being, in accordance with statutory provisions

Lead a curriculum area

- In consultation with the Head to produce guidelines and school policy for a specific area of the curriculum.
- To plan, in consultation with all members of staff, the way in which the curriculum area will be developed, reviewed and assessed.
- To ensure that there are sufficient resources to make this area viable in school and to keep a regular check on the condition and availability of these resources.
- To attend in-service courses and provide staff with feedback in order to promote further development.
- To liaise from time to time with co-ordinators within the Pyramid to ensure continuity.

The duties and responsibilities of the post may vary from time to time according to the changing demands of the school. This Job Description may be reviewed at the reasonable discretion of the Headteacher in the light of those changing requirements and in consultation with the post holder.
