The successful candidate will foster a safe, nurturing, and engaging environment, improving the life chances of every pupil and helping them reach their full academic and personal potential within our school community.

Main Duties and Responsibilities

1. Key Person Responsibilities

- Act as a designated **Key Person** for a specific group of children, building strong, supportive, and trusting relationships with them and their families.
- Serve as the primary advocate and guide for your assigned children, monitoring their development, progress, and emotional well-being.
- Facilitate smooth transitions between home and school through regular, open communication with parents and carers.

2. Supporting Teaching and Learning

- Support the delivery of the **EYFS framework** through creative and engaging "continuous provision" and structured activities.
- Deliver targeted support to make foundational English, Mathematics, and understanding the world fun, accessible, and impactful.
- Adapt learning activities dynamically to meet the diverse needs of children from all backgrounds, cultures, and varying abilities (including SEND).

3. Safeguarding and Pupil Welfare

- Maintain the highest standards of child protection and safeguarding at all times, strictly adhering to school policies and **'Keeping Children Safe in Education' (KCSIE)** guidelines.
- Work collaboratively with the Designated Safeguarding Lead (DSL) to ensure every child at Well Lane Primary School is safe, happy, protected, and heard.
