We are a well-qualified, experienced and enthusiastic department working cooperatively with a high level of shared decision-making. Teaching commitments and department responsibilities are distributed in order to offer opportunities for career development. We offer a high level of support for Early Career Framework teachers and PGCE students.

Accommodation

The English department has its own suite of six spacious rooms equipped with interactive whiteboards with a large office and stock cupboards nearby. Members of the department have their own dedicated classroom. The English department is responsible for the well-stocked and spacious fiction room, with over 4,000 books. There is a full-size drama studio with all the necessary sound and lighting systems which enable the teaching of the drama aspects of the English scheme of learning, if desired. The department has easy access to computer facilities in nearby blocks.

Resources

The English department is well equipped with books and non-fiction resources. All teacher-produced materials are shared and easily accessible. Creative and regularly-reviewed schemes of learning are established and in place for all key stages. Each classroom in the English block has an interactive whiteboard and visualiser. Reprographic facilities are excellent, as is technician support. We use existing stock creatively and therefore capitation allows for development. There are Teaching Assistants dedicated to the English department, who work collaboratively with staff to support and enhance students' learning.

Student groupings

Students are taught in mixed ability groups at Key Stage 3 and 4.

We have an excellent working relationship with the Supportive Education department and work very closely with the Study Centre manager.

Examination Courses

GCSE: Edugas English / English Language and English Literature.

The vast majority of our Year 10/11 students are entered for Eduqas English Language and English Literature. A very small number of students follow the Eduqas Entry Level English course.

Timetable

There are 50 one hour lessons per fortnightly cycle. Currently, Years 7, 8 and 9 have six lessons per cycle. One will be in the fiction room of the Study Centre. There are nine English lessons for Years 10 and 11, again one of which takes place in the fiction room.

Current priorities:

- Ensuring that the literacy of our weakest students in KS3 is improved rapidly through effective interventions to improve reading comprehension;
- Effectively supporting students with additional needs (SEN K) through implementing the EEF-recommended 'SEND 5 a Day' approaches;
- Improving the performance of boys at GCSE through using the 'Me, We, You' metacognitive approach.

A Reading Community

The school prides itself on being a reading community where all members are encouraged to participate in literacy activities including author visits, reading competitions, etc. Some of these are detailed below:

- Several award shadowing book groups;
- A strong link with the University of the Third Age and evening sessions for their members including a film club, ICT courses, etc;
