All the pupils have an Education Health Care Plan (EHCP) and are taught in small groups. JOB ROLE: English Teacher

Job Purpose:

To teach pupils within the school with particular responsibility for the general education, pastoral care and welfare of the pupils in their class. This includes maintaining pupil records, assessment and liaison with parents and other professionals, and to carry out such duties as are reasonably assigned by the Headteacher.

Role and Responsibilities

This job description is to be performed in accordance with the provisions of the School Teachers' Pay and Conditions Document and within the range of teachers' duties as set out in that document.

Main Core Duties:

- To plan and prepare courses, schemes of work and individual lessons, appropriate to the needs, interests, experience and existing knowledge of pupils
- To assist in the development of appropriate syllabuses, resources, schemes of work, marking policies and teaching strategies in the English Faculty
- To contribute to the Faculty's improvement plan and its implementation
- To contribute to the whole school's planning activities
- To contribute to the Faculty process of self-review, evaluation and improvement planning activities.

Responsibilities:

- To teach, according to their educational needs, pupils assigned to the class
- To monitor, assess and maintain records on pupils' progress, academic and behavioural, and use these to inform planning and teaching
- To supervise the work of any School Support Assistants (SSAs) within the classroom, delegate duties and to maintain an ordered classroom
- To maintain discipline in accordance with the school's policy on behaviour
- To contribute to meetings, discussions and consultations necessary to co-ordinate the work within English and the school as a whole
- To promote equal opportunities within the school and to represent the school positively
- To demonstrate good practice and to be able to support and encourage colleagues

- To continue personal development in the relevant areas including subject knowledge and teaching methods
