We are very fortunate to have a team of passionate, skilled and dedicated English teachers with a broad range of interests and a wealth of teaching experience. There are seven members of the English department, including three members of SLT. It is a very highly regarded department within the school and within our Trust (RET).

The mission of our English department is to help every

child fall in love with the subject and succeed, not only in public examinations, but also in building the skills they need for their futures. We all believe in the power of reading for pleasure, promoting this in our lessons and across the school.



Our schemes of work are designed to expose students to a wide range of texts, from a variety of genres, forms, time periods and writers. We teach language and literature lessons, and read whole texts as well as extracts. In Year 7, we focus on helping students understand 'The Big Picture' in a text. In Year 8, we move to looking at 'The Writer's Craft' and in Year 9 we look

more closely at 'Voice, Intent, Perspective'. This sets a solid foundation for the skills students need at GCSE and A-Level, where we teach the Edexcel specification.

We regularly run writing competitions, reading challenges and theatre trips, and recently welcomed Bali Rai for an author visit and creative writing workshop.

We are national leaders in the effort to diversify our curriculum, and were one of the first schools to teach a text by a black female writer at GCSE (Malorie Blackman's 'Boys Don't Cry'). We have worked closely with Penguin and Edexcel on their 'Lit in Colour' programme in order to promote the importance of a diverse curriculum to all schools nationally.
