



Special Educational Needs Department

The SEND department is based in the school's specialist Inclusion Suite which is centrally located in the school adjacent to the library. This dedicated area is equipped with netbooks, desktop computers, and a Smartboard. The team is led by the Assistant Headteacher for SEND. There are also currently 2 Senior Learning Support Assistants, 1 Enhanced Learning Support Assistants and 10 Learning Support Assistants, one of whom works part time.

- Our new school includes an excellent, centrally located, specialist Inclusion Suite and SEND base with a sensory area.

At St Mary’s we recognise the importance of inclusion in providing effective learning opportunities for all students. Central to this aim is the setting of suitable learning challenges and responding to students’ diverse needs. We strive to overcome potential barriers to learning so that all of our students fulfil their potential.

Before students begin at St Mary’s, the SEND team liaise regularly and effectively with the primary schools to collect all the relevant information on children to enable us to immediately meet their needs and ensure a smooth transition to the school. Once in the school, the team is in regular contact with parents and welcomes them in to school to see the resources and programmes used to meet the needs of each child.

Students are encouraged to develop their skills, knowledge and understanding of subjects using varied approaches to learning. Ultimately, students at St Mary’s succeed because they are well supported in their learning.
