Building on our existing enhanced resource base for KS2 we have opened a second classroom aimed at supporting 8 children with communication and interaction as their primary need.

The role will involve leading the KS1 provision, delivering bespoke programmes of work and support to pupils, and working in collaboration with outside agencies to ensure the highest of outcomes and provision. The successful candidate will work alongside a forward-thinking Senior Leadership Team and an existing structure to highly support communication and interaction needs both within the schools and across Hull Collaborative Academy Trust.

The Trustees of HCAT are seeking to appoint a motivated, skilled and resilient teacher with experience in supporting children on the Autistic Spectrum/Attachment difficulties and preverbal children.
