## **Job Description**

- Provide timely and effective preparation of materials for lessons (from Key Stage 3
  - Key Stage 4), through regular liaison with teaching staff.
- To clear and tidy workplaces and preparation areas after lessons and at the end of the day, including laundry.
- Checking and compiling stock lists for equipment and resources.
- Assist students with practical work as directed.
- Carry out regular safety checks on equipment and classrooms as appropriate.
- To ensure the maintenance of a healthy and safe working environment through:
- actively contributing to the assessment, monitoring and review of both health & safety procedures and information resources.
- Keeping up to date with current procedures and practices through Continuing Professional Development.
- The provision of technical advice and support on health & safety issues to teaching and trainee staff
- The safe treatment and disposal of used materials including hazardous substances and responding to actual or potential hazards.
- Be able to maintain equipment and arrange necessary servicing (cookers).
- Place orders and work to budget (food ingredients shopping as required)
- Maintain health and safety standards, including food hygiene.
- Be aware of lesson rotations and liaise with teaching staff regarding the planning and organisation of materials and equipment for practical lessons.
- Completing risk assessments.
- Photography of practical work.
- Making lesson resources.
- Reprographics as needed.
