Thank you for your interest in applying for the position of Foundation Stage Leader at Beddington Infants' School.

This is a popular three-form entry infant school with a Nursery, located in Wallington, Surrey, across the road from Beddington Park. We have a unique approach to learning that has been developed over time by the staff and children, Learning Maturally.

This active-learning model, building on the Early Years model, is highly successful for all of our pupils. 'Children thrive here,' Ofsted July '23.

Our children fulfil their academic potential whilst developing their social, emotional and physical needs as they grow as individuals, learning indoors and outside every day. High quality Early Years practice and a play based approach to learning is at the heart of everything we do. All pupils are valued and individuality is celebrated.

There is an exceptionally strong sense of community at Beddington Infants' School. We pride ourselves on the positive relationships we have with our pupils, our families, across our staff and governor teams, with external professionals and with our local community.

We consider wellbeing to be a fundamental building block for learning. If children don't feel safe and happy, their capacity to learn is diminished. Equally, if wellbeing of staff isn't a priority they are not in a position to offer their best to the children and each other.

In developing our learning offer we consider what children need, rather than what has always been done. The successful candidate will be joining a creative and dynamic team.

We invest in staff development, providing a wide variety of opportunities to engage in personalised training. We offer a peer mentoring programme, access to the National College, strong links with our partner schools in the Sutton Education Trust (SET) and with Holy Trinity Junior School.

We offer opportunities to access externally provided qualifications such as National Professional Qualifications (NPQs).

We are active members of Challenge Partners and were recently awarded *Leading* in all areas, including being accredited with an *Area of Excellence for Developing Independence in Children*.

There is a lot of interest in our Learning Naturally approach so we offer visits for professionals. This is a very exciting time for our school and we are looking forward to welcoming a Foundation Stage Lead who will enjoy being a part of sharing our practice with other schools.

Leavning Naturally at Beddington Infants' School

Learning Naturally is a unique approach to learning that has been developed over time by the staff and children of Beddington Infants' School.

The Learning Naturally methodology enables children to fulfil their academic potential, whilst supporting their social, emotional and physical needs as they develop as individuals, learning indoors and outside every day.

The Leavning Naturally approach stemmed from our study of how young children learn, with a focus on creating the optimum conditions for learning.

We consider wellbeing to be a fundamental building block for learning. If children don't feel safe and happy, their capacity to learn is diminished.

In developing our learning offer, we considered what children need, rather than what has always been done; as a result, our offer has three strands:

- 1. <u>Short Whole Class Lessons</u> at key points throughout the day.
- 2. <u>Small Group Learning</u> allowing the adults to tailor the learning to the needs of the individual, giving immediate feedback and addressing any potential misconceptions
- 3. <u>Independent Learning Time</u> This is a time for pre-learning, reinforcing and using & applying concepts. Adults monitor the independent learning to ensure that children are using the time wisely and learning to their potential.
