3. Curriculum

Key Stage 3

The Performing Arts Faculty currently offers Drama, Music and Dance to KS3, KS4 and KS5. At KS3 students have one lesson of each subject per fortnight and complete three Units across the Year.

Key Stage 4

In KS4 we currently offer Dance as the BTEC Technical Award in Performing Arts (Dance Approach).

Key Stage 5

At KS5 we offer BTEC Extended Certificate Level 3 in Performing Arts.

4. Faculty Accommodation and Resources

The Performing Arts Department is lucky to be housed in its own building, which consists of:

- A Dance studio
- Two Drama studios
- Two Music classrooms
- A Mac suite
- Multiple rehearsal rooms

The Spectrum Theatre itself opens up into a medium sized room with tiered seating, stage lights and sound equipment for shows and Performing Arts events.

5. Extra-Curricular Activities

Extra-Curricular activities are the beating heart of the Performing Arts department. We currently run Dance clubs for all Year groups, School band, Singing group and Drama club which also involves the technical side of Theatre. We produce a school show every year and we have a Christmas Carol concert and various other showcases throughout the Academic Year. There are a number of theatre visits to expose our students to professional performance in all media.
