

Dear Candidate

Thank you for your interest in the role of **Head of English** at Park House School. This is a unique and exciting opportunity for an inspirational and aspirational teacher to join Park House and further contribute to the life chances of our young people in the school and across the trust.

We are based in Newbury in Berkshire which in itself is in a beautiful area of the country and provides good access to Oxford and London. The area we serve is diverse, and therefore our catchment and students offer a range of expectations and challenges, being able to drive ambitions is key. Our ambition for our students to have the best chance of success is central to our drive and vision. This is best evidenced by our incredible results in the summer exams of 2023 and 2024. Whilst the nation's results plummeted back to pre-pandemic levels, Park House has had two years of significant improvements and in 2024 attained their best results ever at both GCSE and A-Level. Furthermore, the school has attained the highest grades at both GCSE and A-Level in West Berkshire. Progress 8 is again well above the national average this year at +0.6.

Park House School joined the Greenshaw Learning Trust on 1st September 2022. We are proud members of the Greenshaw Learning Trust, a 'family' of like-minded schools, that collaborate to provide mutual support, share their good practice and learn from each other, whilst retaining and developing our own distinctive character.

We encourage all young people to work hard and make the most of the opportunities they are given. Teaching:

- To undertake a designated programme of teaching across all key stages

Head of Department:

 - advising on appropriate classroom management
 - advising regarding allocation of students to teaching groups within the Learning Area/Year following appropriate consultation
 - being responsible for the conduct and behaviour of relevant assigned students, and providing support for colleagues
 - advising regarding allocation of staffing for timetabling purposes
 - monitor and analyse the academic performance of students on an ongoing basis and provide relevant reports when requested
 - devise and implement appropriate intervention strategies
 - complete self-evaluation documentation, in particular data analysis of student performance at Key Stage 3, Key Stage 4 and Post-16 as part of the whole School self-evaluation process.
 - Promote Literacy, Numeracy and communication skills across the Learning Area
- Manage allocated resources, through colleagues where applicable.
 - Controlling expenditure allowances and fulfilling the School's budgeting expectations
 - Overseeing the usage, storage and security of all facilities and resources
 - Ensuring the maintenance of relevant inventories according to School policies
- Contribute to the School's self-evaluation process especially regarding the data analysis of the Learning Area.

 - encouraging members of the Learning Area to keep abreast of developments in their subject areas
 - participating in performance management/appraisal arrangements
 - identifying, providing and accessing appropriate INSET
 - Contribute to the School's consultative process by convening and/or participating in all appropriate calendared meetings, and by ensuring Learning Area/Year representation at all additional relevant Academy meetings.
 - Having delegated responsibility for the implementation of Health and Safety as may be agreed.
 - Provide information about the work of assigned curricular/pastoral areas, and the progress of students, to the line manager, Principal, Trust, colleagues and parents when required, reflecting appropriate 'self evaluation'.

Other Job Requirements

The teacher will be part of the School's appraisal scheme. They will have a team leader who will set agreed targets for the year. The team leader will monitor and review performance, including classroom teaching.

The School will support the continuing professional development of all staff, to ensure that their expertise is being kept up to date.

The duties and responsibilities in this job description are not restrictive and the post holder may be required to undertake any other duties that may be required from time to time. Any such duties should not however substantially change the general character of the post.

1. Application

2. Shortlisting

Shortlisting will be finalised on w/c 21st April 2025. Shortlisted applicants will receive an email inviting them to select their preferred interview time. Please ensure you enter your correct email address on your application form and provide a contact telephone number. References may be taken up after shortlisting. Please ensure you indicate clearly on your application form if you are happy for us to do so.

3. Interview Process

Interviews will be held on w/c 28th April. Applicants may also be asked to undertake a practical test related to the knowledge and abilities in the Person Specification.
