

Job Description - Head of Geography

Leadership responsibilities

- Lead the department with vision and ambition to ensure the highest quality of education in Geography across Key Stages 3-5.
- Strategically lead on improving progress and attainment in Geography.
- Strategically lead on curriculum development in Geography across all key stages to ensure the delivery of a high quality, aspirational curriculum that promotes the acquisition of knowledge and development of deep understanding, to support excellent progress and attainment for all students.
- Ensure that well planned schemes of learning are in place with the accompanying resources to meet the academic needs of all students.
- Lead the implementation of a strategic department development plan and regularly engage with high quality assurance to monitor impact, evaluating success and identify further areas for development.
- Build high quality relationships with parents/carers, the Trust and the wider community.
- Regularly monitor the progress of pupils using appropriate data and lead the raising attainment process across the department.
- Seek opportunities to work collaboratively with stakeholders across the Trust and the wider education community.
