Our academy

The Mossbourne story began in 2004 with a clear but challenging mission - to improve academic outcomes in a borough with some of the lowest rates of attainment in the country. Over the past sixteen years, Mossbourne Academies have been at the vanguard of truly dramatic change in terms of the quality of education and outcomes in Hackney, now one of the best places to be educated in the UK.

Mossbourne Victoria Park Academy opened in 2014 in order to serve the community in the south-east of the borough. We deliver an outstanding education to 840 local children.

We are not a normal school. Our incredibly high expectations for behaviour and courtesy create a calm working atmosphere for students and staff, which means that teachers can focus one hundred percent on teaching and students have one hundred percent focus on learning.

The Mathematics Learning Area

The Mathematics Learning Area employs ten maths teachers. Responsibility for the learning area is shared between the Head of Learning Area [HOLA], Head of Department, a second in department and several other members of the team. The learning area is well resourced with eight classrooms — with interactive whiteboards, webcams and visualisers. Maths achieved a VA of 0.75 in 2018/2019, but the expectation is that this will increase significantly over the coming years.

The Extended Leadership Team

The Extended Leadership Team (ELT) consists of the Principal, the Vice Principals, the Associate Vice Principals, the Heads of Learning Area and other middle leaders. The ELT support the Principal in both the day -to-day running of the Academy and in shaping the medium and longer-term strategy for maintaining outstanding student outcomes.
