Job Description Head of Music

Main Purpose

- Uphold and promote the school's Catholic ethos in daily school life.
- Raise student achievement through well-planned lessons and effective departmental leadership.
- Ensure the highest standards of teaching and learning in your subject.
- Work in line with the DfE's Teachers' Standards.

Key Responsibilities

Strategic Direction

- Develop and communicate a clear vision for the department.
- Implement and monitor department policies to support high-quality teaching.
- Promote the subject's value to maintain strong student uptake at KS4 and KS5.
- Monitor and evaluate the subject's impact on student achievement and feed into school and departmental plans.
- Promote students' spiritual, moral, social, cultural, physical, and mental development.
- Work with the SENDCo to adapt the curriculum for different learning needs.
- Link teaching to career opportunities and coordinate with feeder primary schools and the local authority.

Curriculum Leadership

- Oversee curriculum planning and sequencing to ensure student progress.
- Ensure consistent and effective curriculum delivery.
- Implement a robust assessment system to track student progress.
- Take responsibility for student outcomes and standards in the subject area.

Staff Leadership and Management

- Build an effective team and hold regular meetings.
- Provide support for teaching, learning, and resource planning.

- Monitor teaching standards through lesson observations and student feedback.
- Offer constructive feedback and identify training needs.
- Manage staff appraisal and professional development.
- Ensure staff are familiar with exam requirements and manage exam entries accurately.
- Oversee student behaviour and discipline within the department.

Resource Management

- Ensure classrooms are well-maintained and visually stimulating.
- Manage departmental resources and budget effectively.
- Provide appropriate resources for remote learning.

Pastoral Support

- Act as a form tutor, monitoring student wellbeing and progress. Uniquely, this would be a vertical form of passionate student musicians.
- Support students' participation in the School Council.
- Liaise with parents and external agencies where necessary.
- Deliver PHSE programmes and report safeguarding concerns promptly.

General Responsibilities

- Engage with the school's CPD and appraisal programmes.
- Support whole-school events, including Open Evenings and Parents' Evenings.
- Follow Health and Safety and Data Protection policies.
- Undertake break duties and other tasks as required by the Headteacher or SLT.

This job description will be reviewed annually and may be adjusted after consultation.
