The Music Department

Music is taught to all students in Key Stage Three. As a performing art, a great deal of emphasis is placed on the practical aspects but these skills are underpinned by knowledge about the subject. Activities in lessons include composing, performing, arranging, vocal and instrumental improvisation, listening and appraising. This approach continues at Key Stage Four.

Many girls learn a musical instrument in lessons given by specialist teachers and everyone is encouraged to participate in a wide variety of extra curricular clubs, including the school orchestra, choirs, reeds ensemble and many more, which take place during lunchtimes.

There are regular performance opportunities both in and out of school, including our annual Carol Service, Summer Concert and inter-house opportunities such as the Year 7 Concert and the House Music competition.

The department boasts a large teaching room, equipped with keyboards, ukuleles and percussion, as well as a separate Mac suite, solely for the use of the music department for composing. There are 8 practice spaces which are used for the delivery of private music tuition and for use as practice spaces for the students.

Continuing Professional Development

At Torquay Girls' Grammar School, all staff have access to a wide range of Continued Professional Development (CPD).

Our internal CPD cycle for teachers is informed by the 'TGGS Teaching and Learning Framework', focusing on evidence informed pedagogy designed to impact further the outstanding progress made by students at our school. We aim to gain a deep understanding of 'how' pedagogical approaches can be refined and adapted to support all learners in our classrooms, before sharing and embedding the practice to deliver consistently great lessons.

In addition to this, staff at every stage of their career have a wide ranging and evolving offer of significant investment, to ensure the development of people sits at the heart of our vision.

Our long term vision is to support additional investment in our frontline teaching and develop a fully embedded instructional programme model to enhance the delivery of our framework further. By ensuring that our CPD offer achieves advancements in both teachers' technical knowledge and their professional judgment in applying this knowledge in action, teachers develop into adaptive experts who can flexibly and

effectively apply their technical knowledge to their unique contexts and adjust when these contexts change. To do so, we must have a clear idea of the kinds of technical knowledge and professional judgment capacities that teachers need to effectively serve our students. While many CPD programmes focus on specific elements of teaching, such as culturally responsive pedagogy or supporting social and emotional learning, at Torquay Girls' Grammar School we aim to provide more comprehensive support so that we can meet teachers wherever they are on their journey toward professional expertise.





Working at TGGS

Being part of the 'TGGS family' is special in many ways. Whatever role you play within the school community, there is so much that makes TGGS a great place to work.

Our school is situated on a great site with fantastic facilities including our lecture theatre, Sports Hall, and a fully kitted gym suite which staff can access. Across the year, there are also opportunities to join staff after school clubs including yoga and badminton - a great way to keep fit and socialise with colleagues! There are also organised staff walks on Dartmoor, and not forgetting our annual sponsored walk which raises £1000s for charity.

Our staff love to get involved with whole school events. Sports Day, Christmas Events, the House Shout and the Staff Lip Sync Battle are some of the highly anticipated dates in the calendar. Staff are also encouraged to be part of our wider extra-curricular offer by going on day and residential trips - Iceland and Rome to name a couple!

Our Parents and Teachers Association (PTA) has recently relaunched and they have been planning events for both staff and students, with the last quiz night proving a big success. Whether you would like to be part of the PTA or simply come along to the events for some fun, it is a great way to get involved with fundraising for the school.

As a new member of staff at TGGS, you will receive a full induction to the school which continues beyond your first week, to help you to be as successful in your role as possible. As a school, staff have access to a range of benefits from day one, including access to a good pension, the Cycle to Work scheme through salary sacrifice, and access to an Employee Assistance Programme alongside supportive policies for every personal eventuality.


