Warlingham School & Sixth Form College is a fully comprehensive community-focussed, school, with a PAN of 240. The School provides a caring, supportive environment, where staff and students work with integrity and respect. The school places a high importance on its key values of Commitment, Courage and Kindness, which we strive to make a reality every day.

At Warlingham, we want our students to be safe and happy at school and as a result, enjoyment and engagement are important elements of life at our school. Our student leadership programmes help our students to develop the confidence, grit and resilience needed to be successful in later life. These qualities will help them to develop into well-rounded young people, ready to make a positive contribution to the local community and to wider society in general.

Students are encouraged to have high aspirations so that each can be the very best that they can be, whatever their starting point. Members of staff go the 'extra mile' for students and are dedicated to nurturing young people's talents and aspirations. We expect our students to work hard, behave respectfully, dress smartly and take pride in their achievements.





Our students are also encouraged to have wide horizons and to experience a broad range of opportunities and experiences that enable Warlingham students to grow into confident, articulate young adults who enjoy their time at school and leave with the skills, qualities and qualifications required to face the challenges of the future. Our thriving House system provides a sense of belonging and lots of healthy competition as well as a caring and supportive pastoral structure.

The Sixth Form continues to grow and is currently home to around 250 happy and successful students and offers a wide range of courses, including both A Level and Vocational Courses. We regularly review our sixth form provision and curriculum offer and the Head of Sixth Form will play a significant role in this process, bringing innovative, creative ideas to deliver an ambitious vision that will meet the needs of our students now and in the future. We have an Advance Award scheme which gives our sixth form students the opportunity to participate in a number of exciting enrichment opportunities such as, the Duke of Edinburgh's Award Scheme or the Extended Project Qualification (EPQ). They can also make use of our impressive sporting facilities.

Our strong pastoral system continues to support our students and the personalised approach we offer helps them to achieve their goals in a secure and nurturing environment. Extra-curricular trips, whether a geological visit to Iceland or a trip to Auschwitz run by the Holocaust Educational Trust, all enrich and broaden horizons. Local community-based activities help to develop students' understanding of citizenship and commitment whilst further developing their employability skills.

With the opportunities provided and the quality of the teaching and learning support, it is no surprise that a significant percentage of students go on to be successful at Russell Group universities such as Cambridge, Kings College and Imperial College.





Students

Many of our students live in Surrey and others come from the southern part of the London Borough of Croydon; most of the students live within a three-mile radius of the school. Our students represent a broad socio-economic mix.

There are currently 1,456 students on roll including the sixth form. Although many students stay on for Key Stage 5; we would like to encourage a higher proportion to stay with us. The School is oversubscribed for the Year 7 intake each September.

Facilities

Located south of Warlingham, the purpose-built school sits on an extensive, 20 acre site, with good commuter access by road and two stations within half a mile. The buildings are well maintained, some recently modernised and refurbished and the facilities include extensive adjacent playing fields, a dedicated sixth form block, a fitness suite and a 25-metre swimming pool. Developments at Hamsey Green Primary School, which shares a campus with Warlingham have yielded opportunities for further development, which are currently under discussion.

The School has made significant investments in technology, with several computer suites and two state-of-the-art scientific laboratories.





Staff

The quality of teaching is clearly central to the success of any school. Teachers are the greatest resource a school has. We employ dedicated individuals with positive attitudes and high standards. All our staff go the 'extra mile' for students and take time to nurture young people's talents and aspirations.

Learning takes place in a purposeful and well-disciplined environment, in which students are encouraged to be actively involved in their learning through investigation, problem-solving, discussion, practical work and research. There is a healthy balance between established and early career teachers, and the school is committed to ensuring access to a wide range of CPD opportunities. Warlingham School & Sixth Form College offers teacher training through our School Direct courses, which are designed as school-centred initial teacher training routes and are a popular choice for those who hope to secure a role in the network of schools where they train. The School Direct Programme is provided through the South East Learning Alliance, of which we are a member school. We are also a delivery partner for the Early Career Framework of the Xavier Teaching School Hub.

The teaching staff are well supported by the senior leadership team and a range of experienced teaching assistants and learning mentors who help support additional needs. All support and administrative staff share the same commitment to our caring and respectful school ethos. In addition, we work closely with the MAT shared services team who provide a range of support services for the schools.

Job Purpose


To lead, inspire and manage the sixth form staff team and cohort of students. To ensure high standards of social, personal and academic development for students. To promote the development and ethos of the sixth form, to enable continuing success and sustainable growth.

Key Accountabilities and Tasks

The specific nature and balance of these responsibilities will vary according to the needs of the school and may be shared.

Teaching and Learning

- Meet the requirements of the Teaching Standards as detailed in the STCPD.
- Be a role model of excellent practice for teaching and learning.





- Take an active role in the development of the curriculum across the sixth form.
- Oversee the academic progress of students across the sixth form by working with tutors and heads of department to raise achievement.
- Track student progress across the sixth form, ensuring a rigorous monitoring process is undertaken and key performance measures are evaluated.
- Ensure underachievement is identified, and interventions are planned and monitored for impact.
- Oversee the quality of reports and reviews to ensure that student's progress is communicated effectively to them and to their parents.

Pastoral

- Lead an innovative and engaging induction programme for students.
- Promote an ethos of independent lifelong learning.
- Be accountable for leading and managing student personal development, promoting extra-curricular activities and leadership opportunities.
- Establish an identity and positive ethos for the sixth form, including the management and delivery of assemblies.





- Celebrate student achievement across the sixth form.
- Ensure students adhere to the sixth form, code of conduct and deal with any disciplinary matters.
- Ensure that all students are included and that vulnerable students are supported through liaison with the appropriate teams.
- Support sixth form staff in the leadership and delivery of pastoral support.

Leadership of Staff

- Provide creative and visionary leadership in order to build effective teams and provide strategic direction.
- Ensure successful recruitment to sixth form positions and that effective induction processes are followed.
- Line manage and develop the leadership of Deputy Head of Sixth Form, Head of Year and Sixth Form Support Assistant.
- Work effectively with all admin and student support staff to ensure the smooth and effective running of the sixth form.
- Liaise and work collaboratively with other area leaders, SENDCO and with external agencies as appropriate.
- Support the continuous professional development of staff and promote a culture of mentoring and coaching.
- Review team and individual performance, recognising achievement and dealing with performance issues.
- Ensure that procedures for establishing good practice in tutor periods are in place and followed.
- Ensure effective communication about student progress and wellbeing take place across each year so that tutors can fulfil their role.





School Community

- Proactively promote the sixth form to the school community and the wider community. This will include ensuring successful marketing activities and promotional materials are produced, e.g. open evenings, prospectus, tours etc.
- Identify opportunities for student leadership, engagement and enrichment in community activities through the promotion of the Advance Award.
- Support students applying for university places, apprenticeships or looking for career opportunities post-18.
- Ensure effective liaison with parents regarding student progress and support all relevant parental events.








TANDRIDGE LEARNING TRUST SCHOOLS
