Responsibilities

This post holder will lead the Social Sciences faculty which, from September 2021, will include: business, enterprise, economics, health & social care, psychology and sociology.

The key responsibilities are:

- To lead strategies which maximise achievement of all pupils in Social Sciences
- To lead the head of business/economics and head of psychology/sociology
- To keep the SLT link fully informed on all aspects of developments in the teaching of Social Sciences
- To quality assure Social Sciences provision.
- To be responsible for the implementation and development of the Social Sciences curricula and, working with the heads of department, lead the development of schemes of learning.
- To co-ordinate the preparation and development of all resources and teaching material required by the faculty, including worksheets, supporting material, extension material, tests, homework task and projects where appropriate.

- To liaise with the SLT link regarding the delivery of curriculum initiatives in Social Sciences
- To liaise with teaching staff to keep them informed of all curriculum developments and to advise on schemes of learning and teaching methods.
- To ensure that the curriculum in the department is implemented in accordance with the agreed faculty policy and in line with the values of the school.
- Work to the budgets determined by the school to resource courses and equip teaching areas.
- To be responsible for the maintaining a system of stock and equipment control within the department and for ensuring that Health and Safety regulations are observed.
- To be responsible for ensuring that all Social Sciences rooms are correctly managed and maintained.
- To be responsible for the general appearance of the faculty's facilities.
- To manage assessment recording and reporting for the subject.
- To check departmental reports to parents.
- To have responsibility for the management and behaviour in line with school expectations of pupils when in the department.
- To under take other reasonable duties with regard to the education of pupil as required by the Principal.
