Student Learning

- 5. To maintain appropriate records and to provide relevant accurate and up to date subject area information and for SIMS as required.
- 6. To monitor student progress and use data to inform teaching and learning.
- 7. To communicate effectively with students.
- 8. To communicate effectively with the parents of students.
- 9. To take part as required in Parents' Evenings, Open Evenings, special events and liaison events with other schools (eg, partner primary schools).
- 10. To contribute to the development of effective links with external agencies to enhance the learning process.
- 11. To maintain good order and discipline, and apply the Behaviour for Learning Policy of the school so that effective teaching and learning can take place.

Teaching

- 1. To teach students according to their learning and educational needs, including the setting and marking of work to be carried out in school and elsewhere.
