About Our School

Hose Primary School is a Church of England Voluntary Controlled school, positioned in the heart of the Vale of Belvoir. We believe that our school is an essential part of the village community and its success relies on the support and encouragement of all stakeholders.

At Hose we aim to provide a caring, secure and stimulating environment in which all children flourish and can achieve to the highest personal, social and academic standards of which they are capable. This means that everyone, parents, children, staff, governors and members of the community need to be supportive and committed to working together.
