Ferring C.E Primary School is a one form intake school. We have 7 classes, ranging from year R to year 6, each with a full time teacher, plus a PPA cover teacher. We have 9 teaching assistants, 2 of whom have a focus specifically on inclusion. We currently have 202 pupils on roll, with capacity for 210. It is our aim to be oversubscribed: the school of choice in the local area.

All of our classes are named after countries, from all around the world, and each class learn about the language and culture of their class country.

The school (both pupils and staff) is vertically organised into 'colour' houses. Inter-house competitions, house points for academic and pastoral achievement, and of course Sports' Day all contribute to the weekly, termly, and yearly house point total, which then determines the annual winner of the House Cup.



Our current Deputy Head is the SENCO / Inclusion Manager, supported by an Inclusion Assistant TA.

A large majority of our pupils are from a White British background, with a below average proportion of children from ethnic backgrounds or who speak English as an additional language.

The proportion of pupils who have Special Educational Needs or Disabilities is around 13% - which is just below the national average; those with more serious SEN(D), with an ECHP, is just below average. The proportion of pupils for whom the school receives the Pupil Premium is below average, but has increased recently.

Progress and outcomes at key stage 2 (Reading, Writing and Maths) at expected standard have been following an improving trajectory, taking a dip in 2019; outcomes are still below local authority figures and national. Greater depth is just below national.

Improving progress and outcomes at key stage 2 is a key feature of the Strategic Development Plan.

The Governors acknowledge that this is an area of priority.

Ferring School is a lovely village primary, on the outskirts of the seaside town of Worthing. Chichester Diocese and Church schools

The Diocese of Chichester covers almost exactly the whole of the county of Sussex, relating in educational terms to three local authorities: West Sussex, East Sussex and Brighton and Hove. It covers approximately 1,459 square miles and has a population of 1,492,000; there are 391 parishes. The Bishop of Chichester, The Right Reverend Dr Martin Warner, is assisted by two suffragen bishops and four archdeacons. The Diocese of Chichester Board of Education (DBE) is charged under the 1991 DBE Measure to oversee the work of all Church of England state funded schools in the Diocese (currently 155, educating around 37,000 pupils). The board meets termly, reviewing the work in schools and making decisions on a wide range of policy and practice.

The pupils within the diocese have a wide range of ability and come from diverse social settings. Those who wish to come to one of our schools, whether of Christian faith, other faiths and those who as yet do not profess a faith, are welcome if there is a place.

Whatever the status of our schools we want them to unite under a common end which is that of:

"Learning with meaning and purpose: to know God and shape the world"

We expect teaching and learning to be rooted in the Christian narrative of creation, redemption and future hope. We want our curricula and pedagogy to foster a spirit of enquiry, creativity and to 'walk the talk' of Christian belief and values in every aspect of school life.
