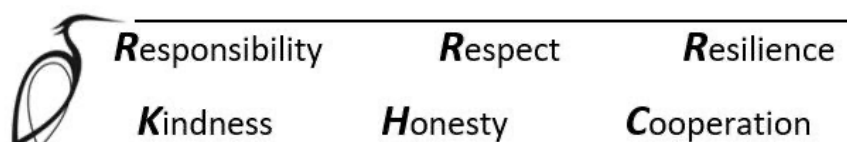

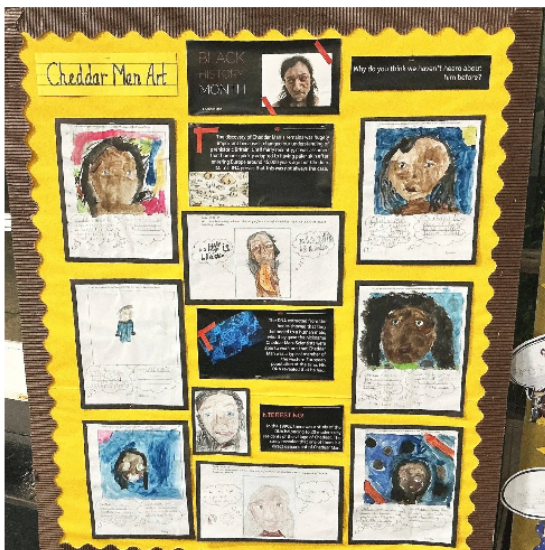


WELCOME TO OUR SCHOOL

We work closely with our Local Authority, Royal Borough of Greenwich. This partnership supports our external review through the Improvement Partner programme and we support the authority by helping it shape its services to schools.

Other partnerships

We work with a number of other organisations who enrich our curriculum. Currently we have links with Punch Drunk Theatre, Bow Arts project and we are exploring how we can make use of the new Woolwich Works organisation.

We recognise that the school is important resource for our local community both in terms of offering support for families and making our buildings available for local events. Through our extensive lettings programme, we offer facilities for a number of Greenwich based groups bringing a wide range of activities to our neighbouring families.

We also make good use of our grounds through our forest school and our current project is the development of outdoor classrooms.
