As a truly inclusive school, Lyde Green Primary is also home to a Specialist Access Centre for up to 16 Key Stage 1 pupils with a diagnosis of ASC (Autistic Spectrum Condition) and complex learning needs .

The School

The school is located within Lyde Green, close to Emersons Green in Bristol and has excellent transport links from the M4 and A roads. Lyde Green Primary is an exciting opportunity for the right candidate. Serving a newly formed community, it opened its doors in 2015 with a clear mission to be at the very heart of local life. The current building is purpose built with fantastic resources and facilities including an outdoor classroom and forest school. Lyde Green was inspected by Ofsted in June 2024 and has an overall effectiveness judgment of '**Good**'. Comments from the report include:

We have a strong track record of school improvement, and a strong trend of improved outcomes and rising pupil numbers. You will be joining us at an exciting time, as we work collaboratively with nine schools (eleven from January 2025) from TPLT in North Somerset, with an aim to join together to form Pathway Trust in the future. We are bringing together the complementary strengths and shared values of both trusts, with the sharing of resources and expertise across an extended network of schools enabling us to further invest in leadership and teaching.

As a trust, our ambition is to enable every child to experience a great education. Each of the schools in the trust has its own unique identity and ethos.
