THE CURRICULUM VISION

DISCOVERING, EXPLORING, CREATING, INNOVATING, IGNITING A LOVE OF LEARNING

We are passionate about our school curriculum, which is personalised to meet the needs of the children in our school. Our school offers something beyond the norm, beyond the prescribed National Curriculum. Our curriculum aims to be memorable, for each child to flourish and grow into a lifelong learner. We use the 3 R's at the centre of our work, these are:

Respect

We teach respect for self, respect for peers and adults, respect for diversity and individual choice.

Responsibility

We give children accountability for their actions, providing good role model and promoting good behaviours.

Resilience

We ask children to learn, improve and rise from failure. We give a can do attitude and positive mindset.

Metacognition

Metacognition is an integral part of our curriculum, giving children the opportunity to discover the joy of learning. Children are encouraged to understand their own unique ways to learn and to recognize the learning process in action. This helps children to understand their own responsibility for their learning and empowers them to make a difference in their lives.

Healthy Living

Promoting healthy living is a key feature within our school. Through excellence in sport, lessons in food technology and promoting a growth mindset, we are helping children to develop healthy minds and bodies. We currently hold the Platinum award for PE and the Very Good award for our School Travel Plan.

THE SCHOOL DAY

School opens at 8:40am and learning starts from the moment children enter, even in the first few minutes before classes begin. We enjoy daily assemblies with focus ranging from topical subjects to music and hold a weekly celebration assembly to recognise pupil's achievements, both academic, sporting and beyond.



SPECIAL EDUCATIONAL NEEDS

Some children may receive additional support as identified by their class teachers. Where appropriate and in consultation with parents, we may seek the help of other professionals who specialize in supporting children with their learning, behavior, social and emotional or physical disabilities. As needed, regular meetings are then arranged with parents, class teachers and our SENDCo to discuss your child.



HOW WE COMMUNICATE WITH PARENTS

Communication between school and home is invaluable. We communicate through our weekly newsletter, emails via our parent communication tool School Gateway and our website. At the end of the school day, if needed, staff will provide parents with a verbal handover.

Twice a year parents are invited to attend parents' evenings to discuss progress and attainment. In practice, parents are in regular contact with the class teacher if either have any concerns and additional meetings can be arranged.

At the end of each academic year, parents receive a written report, providing a detailed overview of children's achievements in all areas of the curriculum.

ABSENCES

The school strives to provide a welcoming and happy environment for all children. Staff will work with children and families to ensure that each child attends school regularly and punctually. Parents must ensure their child attends daily and on time.

If your child is ill, the school office must be informed by 9am that day. Failure to do so may result in an unauthorized absence being recorded.

HOME LEARNING

When homework is set, it is the intention that it is purposeful and extends the children's learning: to motivate them to become resourceful and independent in their pursuit of new knowledge, skills and understanding.

Children should read their reading books at least four times a week; learn any spellings or practice their sounds; and learn their multiplication tables.

We encourage parents to support their children with homework, ensure that it is completed to the best possible standard and handed in on time.

SPECIALIST TEACHERS

At Stoke Mandeville Combined School we have Subject Leaders across each of the curriculum areas, specialising and excelling to lead and enrich the learning opportunities in each subject area.

Events for parents to see specific subjects in action are often arranged in school, for example Maths and English open mornings and Art Week open afternoons.

VISITS

Together we visit places both near and far, from St Mary's Church in Stoke Mandeville and growing vegetables on the allotments next door to outdoor residential adventures and collective school projects such as Young Voices at the O2 in London.

In Year 5 children have a week of exploring and developing their independence by using public transport and Year 6 children go to the River Dart in Devon for four nights.

SAFEGUARDING

OUR COMMITMENT

Every person who works with our children understands their responsibility in keeping children safe and is confident in how they will do that.

Our school community has a duty to safeguard and promote the welfare of children who are our pupils. This means we have Safeguarding and Child Protection policies and procedures in place. Staff, including our volunteers and supply staff, ensure they are aware of our procedure and must complete vetting checks in line with this. We take every precaution in making Stoke Mandeville Combined School a safe environment for the children and regular safety checks are carried out.

MOVING ON

The transitions between years or schools are key milestones, so we work hard to make them a seamless, exciting and positive change. We carry out nursery visits as well as taster visits to help prepare each child for their transition. If one of our children need a little extra encouragement, we'll even tailor a personalised transition for them.

Our Year 6 pupils have an opportunity to visit their new secondary schools in the summer term as well as each year group spending a transition day with their new year group.

FACILITIES

Our village school environment accommodates a large playground and sports field with an outdoor classroom. Reception children have access to their own outdoor play area. Indoors children feel at home in their year group classroom. We have a school hall, a kitchen for children's use and a library, well stocked with recent and classic books. Children swim at the nearby Guttman Centre during Year 4 as part of the sports curriculum.

Our Buddy system carefully pairs a Year 6 pupil with an appropriate Reception pupil and this has a wonderful way of helping children feel happy, valued and secure during their transition to primary school. As well as teaching the older child about responsibility, empathy and compassion, it gives the younger one someone to look up to as a role model and share any questions or worries with.

UNIFORM

The children are required to wear the following school uniform:

- ◊ Navy blue school sweatshirt, cardigan or jumper
- ◊ White polo shirt, shirt or blouse
- ◊ Grey trousers, skirt, pinafore or tailored shorts
- ◊ Blue and white gingham or striped dress for summer
- ◊ Plain white socks for girls, plain dark socks for boys
- ◊ If tights are worn, they should be grey or navy blue
- ◊ Plain black school shoes (no high heels, trainers or open-toed shoes)
- ◊ No jewellery, other than stud earrings and watches, should be worn at school. Long hair must be tied back. If worn, headbands and bows should be small, plain in colour and sympathetic to school uniform.

PE KIT

- ◊ Plain navy blue shorts
- ◊ T-shirt in the child's house colour
- ◊ Trainers for outdoor use
- ◊ Plain tracksuit, jogging bottoms or sweatshirt for outside cold weather PE
