We are seeking to appoint an inspiring, enthusiastic and knowledgeable individual who enjoys, and is confident in, teaching Mathematics up to GCSE. The successful candidate will be keen to gain an HLTA qualification, or already be an HLTA. Fully funded by the school, this is an opportunity for a Teaching Assistant to step up to more responsibility in an Outstanding school, or a stepping-stone to a career as a Maths teacher.

The post would suit a dedicated and hard-working individual who can work independently or in a team. They are likely to have experience of working in a school with children of a relevant age, including those who have specific special educational needs. They should also have a knowledge and understanding of the HLTA standards and be able to demonstrate these standards through the application and interview process.

The post includes working with students from Years 7 to 11, consolidating work covered in their normal Mathematics lessons and working on key Maths and Numeracy skills. For example, you will support students in KS3 with basic arithmetic and fluency of their timetables, or KS4 students revising and preparing for their GCSE in Mathematics.

An ability and willingness to teach small groups of students and to support their skills and individual development is therefore essential.

Reasons staff enjoy working at Waddesdon include:

- High levels of expectations and discipline
- Generous teaching/non-contact period per fortnight for appropriate planning preparation and meeting time
- Positive relations between staff and students

Waddesdon School is an oversubscribed all ability 11–18 school, set in rural Buckinghamshire. The school is 30 minutes away from Oxford and also within easy commuting distance from Milton Keynes. There are just over 1000 students on roll, including 260 in the Sixth Form. The school has an excellent reputation for CPD and recognises and values the contributions of all staff. There are realistic expectations regarding balancing family and leisure time and workload. Governors have recently changed the Admissions Policy to include children of staff members.
