The successful candidate will be expected to teach across Key Stages 3 and 4. We would be pleased to receive applications from NQTs as well as more experienced teachers.

### The RE Department

At Priestlands School, Religious Education seeks to promote equality of opportunity for all students and enable them to benefit from a rich and enjoyable learning experience. Currently the department comprises three teachers: the Head of Department, and two further specialist full-time teachers. The school is keen to consolidate and build on the considerable growth and development of RE experienced in recent years.



At all levels Religious Education is taught as an academically rigorous and highly relevant subject. The department has a strong record of academic success and an increasing number of our leavers go on to Religious Studies, Philosophy and Sociology at A Level at our local colleges.

At Priestlands School, Religious Education seeks to promote equality of opportunity for all students and enable them to benefit from a rich and enjoyable learning experience. We are committed to providing a framework for success for all students and to the delivery of a curriculum which will meet individual needs.



Religious Education is part of the school's core curriculum. It is taught as a discrete subject by specialist teachers in specialist teaching areas. The syllabus at KS3 and KS4 is designed to meet the requirements of the Agreed Syllabus for Hampshire. All classes are taught in broad ability groups. We use a selection of varied and appropriate teaching methods and encourage independent and experiential learning. We recognise that teaching and learning styles are interactive; our programmes of study have been carefully selected to meet student needs and fulfil legal requirements.

At GCSE, students follow the AQA Syllabus A and alongside the four Themes units they study the key beliefs and practices of Buddhism and Christianity. Numbers have rapidly increased in recent years. Currently over 80 students in total are taking the course, with three full sets in Year 11 and three groups in Year 10. The department's GCSE results are excellent and we seek the best for every pupil who takes the course.



The Year 9 has parity of provision on the curriculum with other GCSE options subjects if they opt at the end of Year 9 in which we complete a course on Humanism, Philosophy of Religion and Human Rights. All students follow a foundation course in Ethics – based on the BBC's A-Z of Religion and Ethics.



By its very nature, RE promotes inter-culturalism; students are encouraged to explore diversity of belief and practice and to listen with respect to the beliefs and values of others. A major feature of the school calendar is Holocaust Awareness Day for Year 9 students. The day includes a talk by a Holocaust survivor, something which always leaves students with a lasting and memorable impression. Students also have the opportunity to take part in a five day trip to Germany and Poland which includes a

whole-day visit to Auschwitz-Birkenau. We are also a UCL Beacon School for Holocaust Education and have worked with other organisations to ensure a more comprehensive study of the Holocaust.

The Religious Studies Department is situated in the modern Nichols teaching block and all classrooms offer integrated ICT, sound and projection facilities. We also benefit from a well-situated departmental office. We have a wide range of resources and text books along with artefacts from the major world beliefs.



This continues to be an exciting time in the development of Religious Studies at Priestlands. We are looking to gain the RE Quality Mark in the next couple of years and the successful candidate will be pivotal in our achievement of this award. The successful candidate will share a creative passion for the subject, coupled with a vision for integrating it even more into the life of the School. There is scope for the subject to contribute more fully to the Moral and Spiritual development of students through the School's PSHE programme.

### **The History Department**

The Head of Department provides excellent leadership and, collectively, the team deliver consistently impressive lessons as part of an innovative and exciting curriculum that secures exceptional results.

GCSE results and student progress are consistently strong. The department has built a strong reputation in the school and History is a popular option subjects.

The Department currently offers the GCSE History B (Schools History Project) OCR. In Year 9 students study the rise of the Nazis and life in Nazi Germany. In

year 10 they complete a thematic unit on the People's Health c.1250 to present and a British Depth Study on the Norman Conquest 1065-1087. They also spend a day at Portchester Castle for their History Around Us unit in which they study the features of the castle, why it was built and it's changing use over time. In Year 11 they do a Period Study on the Making of America 1789-1900.



The History Department has been at the forefront of many initiatives at Priestlands. They have developed new marking and feedback strategies to enable students to make rapid progress. They have also developed methods for developing high level thinking, writing Grade 9 exam answers and effective exam revision skills.

The History Department at Priestlands offers thought-provoking and engaging lessons for all students. Stimulating key questions help to drive students' enquiries and create a deeper interest in the subject. Lessons aim to provide the key tenets of pace, challenge and rigour. The Department has worked specifically on promoting thinking skills. It has worked particularly on developing innovative ways of teaching interpretations, causation and using sources of evidence.

The History Department at Priestlands is looking for a talented teacher who is excited by the opportunity to be involved in continued development and change within a truly exceptional Department. The successful candidate should be an impressive classroom practitioner who can help maintain existing standards and sustain the drive to become one of the best departments in the country.
